Loss of Ship Cleopatra.—The U.S. sleop-of-war Decutur, Commander Whittle, when off the coast of Newfoundland on the 27th ult., fell in with the ship Cleopatra, Capt. Leavitt, of this port, 24 days from Liverdoo!, fer Quebec, in distress, with four feet of water in her hold. Two officers and a four feet of water in her hold. 
