

We have the issue upon us now, and how are we to meet it? Well, you, fellow-citizens, from the bottom of my heart, that the only mode which I think available for meeting it is just to tear the Constitution of the United States, trample it under foot, and form a Southern Confederacy, every State of which will be a slave-holding State.

The shrewdest portion of Col. Brooks' nullifying sympathizers will not thank him for this last avowal, as a good portion of their stock in trade—their political capital—is founded on the pretense that the disunion sentiment which has shown itself so prominently in different parts of the South, of late, is the legitimate result of the recent general movements on the part of the Free States to prevent the farther spread of the "peculiar institution."

Col. Brooks says: "If Fremont be elected President of the United States, I am for the people in their majority rising above the law and leaders, taking the power into their own hands, going by concert or not by concert, and laying the strong arm of Southern freemen upon the Treasury and Archives of the Government." [Applause.]

From California. The Steamship George Law arrived at New York on the 12th inst., with California dates to 20th ult., and two million dollars in gold. In California, politics occupied the public mind to the exclusion of all other subjects. The Democrats were acting in opposition to the Vigilance Committee.

EUROPE. European News by the Persia. The intelligence by the Persia is full of interest. Portentous clouds are again gathering over the European horizon, and we must not be surprised if the scenes of the Alma, Balaclava and Sebastopol are acted over again before many months shall have passed away.

We do not do any of the great European Powers the injustice of supposing that their object was simply to have a watchword for the occasion, and that the struggle once over, each pursues a line of conduct suited to its private views and interests.

Starting from this point, we most suppose that it is the intention of all the Powers which participated in the last war, as it is the thought of the Emperor our august master, that the general peace should be the fixed point of departure for the re-establishment of relations based upon the respect of right and the independence of governments.

Without entering into the minute details of some secondary questions, we regret that we are compelled to say that there are two countries which form part of the European family, in one of which the normal condition does not exist, and wherein the other it is threatened with attack.

There is no longer any excuse now for the occupation of the Hellenic territory, against the will of the Sovereign, and in opposition to the sentiments of the nation. Political motives might, to a certain point, explain the violence done to the person of the Sovereign. Necessities of war, more or less proved, might be urged to give a coloring to the infraction of right.

As regards the Kingdom of Naples, it has not yet come to a question of cure; it appears to us much to be feared that it is high time to think of prevention. The King of Naples is the object of a pressure, not because his Majesty has transgressed any engagement imposed upon him by treaty towards foreign Powers, but because, in the exercise of his incontestible rights of sovereignty, he governs his subjects according to his fancy.

We need not tell you the view our august master would entertain on such pretensions. His Majesty flatters himself with the hope that they will not be carried out. He entertains this hope the more confidently, as it is the doctrine also of the States which place themselves at the head of civilization, and where the principles of political liberty have received their greatest development.

It is said that the Piedmontese government has notified to Paris and London its intention of joining a squadron to that of the two great maritime powers in the Bay of Naples.

THE ISLE OF SERPENTS.—The Berlin correspondent of a Frankfort journal states that the second note has been addressed to Russia on the subject of the Isle of Serpents by Great Britain, and that its tone is more peremptory than that of the former note; in consequence of which the irritation which was felt by each party has been much aggravated.

INDIA, CHINA, AND AUSTRIA. Trieste, Oct. 1st.—The steamer Donkey arrived here to-day at 2 P.M., in 135 hours from Alexandria, which port she left on the 25th of September.
