In the name of the Emperor, and in virtue of the powers confided to me, I confer on you the cross of Knight of the Legion of Honour!' He then affixed the cross to the colours in the midst of tremendous cheering and cries. of 'Vive l'Empereur !' He made an attempt ence more to speak, but his emotion prevented him. He alterwards distributed five crosses and twenty one military medals. Our cantiniere, Mme. Tremoreaux, received the medal for her devoted conduct. She followed the regiment continually into the midst of the fire, and it is from her that the wounded received the first attention. She seemed to be everywhere and accordingly what praise and respect does she not receive? Truly we can affirm in our regiment that a good cantiniere is a second Providence."

A dispatch has been issued by the French goveinment to representatives at foreign courts, making known the opinion of the French government as to the policy and attitude of Germany. The dispatch fully enderses the circular sent by the Russian Cabinet to its agents in Germany, declaring the opinion of Russia that the Confederation had not only no grounds for interference in the present war, but Germany, by mixing in the conflict, would depart from ker treaties-and this opinion the French dispatch declares to be true and just.

The new Prussian military measures have not inspired the French government with uneasiness, as France cannot disagree with the views stated by Prussia for taking such steps. The dispatch concludes by stating that without being yet officially acquainted with the views of the English government, France is authorized to draw, from the circumstance of their coming into power, most favorable conclusions for Italy.

Prussia, it is said, has given tranquilising assurances to the French Government.

A Berlin correspondent of the Times says :-The Prussian proposals were in the hands of Russia and England. The writer says that, by the end of the week, the Prussian army will be in full march. Two corps d'armee will be stationed on the Silesian frontier, in case of an unexpected attack on the part of Russia. On the lower and middle Rhine 140,000 Russians will be stationed.

When these preparations are completed, Paussia will probably make her proposals to France, and these will unquestionably be refused.

wenture to accept battle in the condition of de-moralization and stupor into which they have fallen since our victory at Solferino.

FIUME, July 4.—It is asserted that the French, amounting to 10,000 men, have disembarked at Lussien Piccola. The bridge at Chierso has

been destroyed. MILAN, Julv 1. The Legion of Garibaldi, and the division Cialdini are maneuvering to close upon the Valley of Adige, in order to render themselves masters of the Lago de Garda, and isolate Verona from the Tyrol.

BEENE, July 2. A body of Chasseurs d' Alps 5000 strong, arrived at Frans, under command, it is said, of Garibaldi himself.

VILLEGIO, July 4th. (Official.) The French army, increased by Prince Napoleon's corps, will operate against Verona, whilst the part of the Sardinians begins with the stege of Peschiera. TURIN, 4th. (Official.) On the 29th the Sardinians more closely invested the exterior forti-fications of Peschiera, situated on the right bank of the Mincio. Our army crossed the river on the 30th to invest Peschiera on the left bank also.

BERNE, 5th. The Austrians have withdrawn from Bornio. The Piedmontese are advancing towards the Stelvio Pass.

PARTICULARS OF THE BATTLE OF SOLFERINO. Additional details of the battle of Solferino, published in the London Times correspondence with the Austrian army, estimates the Austrian loss at 12,000 to 15,000 killed and wounded. No gonerals were killed, but four or five were wounded. Several colonels and numerous other officers were killed or wounded.

Another account says that the total loss of the Another account says that the total loss of the 2d Austrian army was 230 officers and 9,600 privates killed and wounded. About 4000 were missing, most of whom had returned. The French employed a baloon to give signals when the Austrians were advancing. The Sardinian loss was 59 officers killed, 167 wounded; 642 men killed, 3400 wounded, and 1250 missing.
