HALIFAX, May 28.
Intelligence relative to Garibaldi's expedition still meagre and conflicting; reports generally given in stating he was making good progress; some say he had captured most important positions in Sicily, except Messina and Palermo. After landing at Marsala, Neapolitan War vessels bombarded that town without warning. British vessels interposed for protection of English residents.
Impromptu announcement made via Madrid that King of Naples had applied for Foreign intervention. Among other questionable items was one that treaty offensive and defensive had been concluded between Rome, Austria and all despised Italian Sovereigns.
Latest accounts from Naples represent utmost consternation there. Troops dispirited, tumultuous manifestations taking place, royal family packing up all jewels and valuables, and other strong indications that great insurrection was looked for at any moment.
At latest dates Garibaldi's forces were moving on P. I. rmo.
British Government issued proclamation, a most endorsement for Pope in Ireland, but refused to interfere in subscription for Sicilian insurgents, law officers of Crown not regarding it as illegal.
English funds very heavy under continental politics, but more steady than at close.
Paris Bourse had been greatly depressed. Closed firm at 68.80.

French Minister at Naples asked for ships of war, and vessels had been sent. French fleet was about to sail for Levant.
Vague and unauthentic rumors of a new French loan for military purpose.
Theodore Parker died at Florence on the 10th. Reported Lamoriciere made forward movement with Papal troops, and 6000 Piedmontese troops evacuated from Genoa to check him.
It is positively asserted that the French army in Rome received orders to evacuate that city.
It is said the Sardinian Government ordered garrisons in Central Italy to march rapidly forward towards Pontifical frontier.
General Concha was elected President of the Spanish Senate, and decorated with the order of the Golden Fleece.
The army of Africa entered Madrid amid much enthusiasm.
Austrian Government stated that British Ambassador to Russia on receipt of Gortschakoff's communication relative to Turkey, lodged formal protest against it, but this was not, he only received the communication under reserve, by stating that he intended to refer it to his Government for instruction on the matter. Later despatches say England would not interpose.

Garibaldi's expedition attracts much attention. Nothing authentic relative to his movements, but believed successful. Great consternation at Naples. Every symptom of approaching insurrection.
Theodore Parker is dead.

SECOND DISPATCH.

HALIFAX, May 28.
Intelligence relative to Garibaldi's expedition still meagre and conflicting; reports generally given in stating he was making good progress; some say he had captured most important positions in Sicily, except Messina and Palermo. After landing at Marsala, Neapolitan War vessels bombarded that town without warning. British vessels interposed for protection of English residents.
Impromptu announcement made via Madrid that King of Naples had applied for Foreign intervention. Among other questionable items was one that treaty offensive and defensive had been concluded between Rome, Austria and all despised Italian Sovereigns.
Latest accounts from Naples represent utmost consternation there. Troops dispirited, tumultuous manifestations taking place, royal family packing up all jewels and valuables, and other strong indications that great insurrection was looked for at any moment.
At latest dates Garibaldi's forces were moving on P. I. rmo.
British Government issued proclamation, a most endorsement for Pope in Ireland, but refused to interfere in subscription for Sicilian insurgents, law officers of Crown not regarding it as illegal.
English funds very heavy under continental politics, but more steady than at close.
Paris Bourse had been greatly depressed. Closed firm at 68.80.

French Minister at Naples asked for ships of war, and vessels had been sent. French fleet was about to sail for Levant.
Vague and unauthentic rumors of a new French loan for military purpose.
Theodore Parker died at Florence on the 10th. Reported Lamoriciere made forward movement with Papal troops, and 6000 Piedmontese troops evacuated from Genoa to check him.
It is positively asserted that the French army in Rome received orders to evacuate that city.
It is said the Sardinian Government ordered garrisons in Central Italy to march rapidly forward towards Pontifical frontier.
General Concha was elected President of the Spanish Senate, and decorated with the order of the Golden Fleece.
The army of Africa entered Madrid amid much enthusiasm.
Austrian Government stated that British Ambassador to Russia on receipt of Gortschakoff's communication relative to Turkey, lodged formal protest against it, but this was not, he only received the communication under reserve, by stating that he intended to refer it to his Government for instruction on the matter. Later despatches say England would not interpose.
Markets.—Cotton quiet, quotations unchanged. Provisions quiet. Breadstuffs steady. Wheat slightly advanced. Consols 94 1/4 to 94 1/2 for money 94 1/4 for account. Bullion in Bank of England increased £154,000. Money market generally unchanged—less demand.
