RETURN OF FIRE INSURANCE DUTY FOR 1861.

(Ordered by the House of Commons to be printed, July 8, 1861.)

THE Annual Return, just published by the Government, shows that the increase of Duty paid by the "Queen Insurance Company," since 1860, exceeded that of thirty-eight other Fire Offices, some of which have been in operation for upwards of half a century.
