NEW YORK, Sept. 22. The steamer General Buel, plying between Louisille and Cincinnati, was seized by 200 guerillas at Warsaw, Ky., on Thursday evening, and Dr. Ferris, he mail agent, was taken away by them. He had formerly been Provost Marshal of Warsaw, while Burbridge was in command of the district of Kenucky, and had executed two guerillas near that own. It is supposed that he was seized in revenge, and will probaby be murdered.

Boston, Sept. 24. A despatch from Toronto has the following :-The Daily Evening Telegraph says the Government has issued a circular to County Attorneys and Police Magistrates, instructing them to order the seizure of all arms in the possession of parties whom they considered dangerous to the public peace, and all persons known or suspected of having connections with Fenians will be vigorously prosecuted. Three Fenians were committed to jail to day, and a list of several hundred names including some well known residents of this city, is now in the hands of the police. Strict inquiries have been made by the police and detectives now in the city in regard to everything connected with Fenianism.

From this time torward every Railroad train and steamer arriving in this city will be closely watched and suspicious characters searched and arrested, and if their business is not satisfactorily explained they will be committed to jail under the habeas corpus act of the last Parliament.

NEW YORK, Sept. 25. At a Fenian Pic-Nic yesterday Stephens made a speech in which he repeated that fighting would ommence in Ireland this year and he would be with hem in the fight. A Toronto special of yesterday says: Orders have been given to the whole force of the city to muster at given points on the first alarm of fire, to be all accounted with forty rounds of ball cartridges. An attempt to burn or capture the city is eared. Large quantities of military stores, including mbulances, are arriving here. The regular troops and volunteers are continually moving hither and hither. A yacht was seized to-day, and her crew of hree men arrested on suspicion of being Fenians. A small quantity of ammunition was found on board. An Ottawa, C. W., despach says : Cabinet meetings of the Canadian Government are being held daily in Quebec, the subjects discussed being the military condition of the Province, Confederation, and the failure of the Bank of Upper Canada. Much uncertainty is felt in financial circles. The Feniaus are said to be assembling for an invasion at Highgage: Large quantities of military stores are being received at Toronto and Montreal and sent to the Western portion of the Province.
