ENGLISH AND FOREIGN.

UNIVERSITY REFORM.

We rejoice to see that a bill to repeal the clause the act of uniformity which requires that persons elected to be Fellows of Colleges shall subscribe declaration of conformity to the formularies and doctrines of the Church of England, has received the sanction of the House of Commons, the second reading having been carried by 200 to 156. In the debate that took place upon it, the broad question was raised that these are not mere Church of England, but are national, institutions, in the advantages of which all classes of Her Majesty's subject are entitled to participate, and this view was ably supported by Mr. Fawcett, Mr. Morrison, and Mr. Cardwell. This, of course, is the true idea. If national institutions, then why should not the whole nation participate in their benefits and emoluments ? Bigotry and superstition must give place to the soul-elevating principles of social and religious liberty.

The Reform bill is rapidly becoming the law of the realm. The provisions of the bill are such as to inaugurate a social revolution in the nation, involving responsibilities sufficiently serious to awaken the deepest thoughtfulness. The Christian World in remarking upon this wondrous change, says : " The governing power in a free State is its electoral constituency, and it has for two centuries been indisputable that the executive sovereignty of England is vested in the Parliament. There can be no doubt that every power which can be exercised by the Parliament of Great Britain is now put within the grasp of the body of the population."

Admitting this statement as correct, how important that the masses should be educated and christianized. Such only are prepared for self-government.

A Reform mob recently created a disturbance at St. James' Hall, London, by attacking a Tory meeting. Arrests were the result .- A very formidable anti-Popery riot occurred recently in Birmingham. The rioters were out in great force. The Roman Catholics was threatened with demolition, and the rioters at one time had Birmingham in their hands. Troops were ordered in sufficient numbers to quell the mob, and peace was restored .- William Lloyd Garrison has been honored by a London Committee with a public breakfast. The Duke of Argyle was chairmain of the committee, and John Bright, M. P., was expected to preside on the occasion.

Lonpon, June 20 .- To-day was the 30th anniversary of the acceptance by Queen Victoria of the Throne of the United Kingdom. Bells were rung, a royal salute was fired at St. James Park, and flags were displayed all over London.

The Queen is at Windsor Castle this morning The authorities of this metropolis have voted to present addresses of congratulation to the Emperors of Russia and France on their escape.

An intimate friend of the deceased writes that he was present and heard the will of the late Artemas Ward read for the first time in this country, and that after providing for his mother and the boy Stephen, he gives the five children of John C.
