He alluded to reverses as "dark spots on the borizon? and commented at length on the pacific state of aff irs in Europe. He spoke encouragingly to the people and prophesied that the certainty of peace would give a good impetus to trade, while he blamed the Directors of the public press for spreading unfounded rumors and creating general distrust. He himself would do all in his

power to recall confidence, London, Aug. 31. — The little schooner-yacht "John T, Ford," Capt. Gold, which sailed from Baltimore, June 23d for Paris, capsized when at her journey's end, on the 19th of August, when entering the English Channel. A sudden squall upset the little craft. One man, named Armstrong, was saved.

PARIS, Aug. 31.-Later in the day yesterday the Emperor Napoleon arrived at Amiens, where he also made a few remarks. He considered that the enthusiastic receptions which have been everywhere extended to him throughout the country attested the patriotism of the people and their confidence in the Government. Alluding briefly to the Mexican question, he did not think French honor had been tarnished or French prestige impaired. Late events in Germany left France tranquil, and she would remain so. He was certain that the peace in Europe would not be disturbed. In conclusion he expressed his desire for the establishment of more liberal institutions and a more active trade, and which he assured his enthusiastic listeners he would do his utribet to promote

Lord Stanley informs Sir Frederick Bruce that England is willing to submit the claims of American citizens for damages caused by the Alabama, and all other similar damages on the part of the United States, to a commission, the arbitration of claims of British subjects against the United states for losses suffered during the late war, being likewise submitted to the same commission.

Paris, Sept. 1 .- Baron Moustier, the Minister Foreign Affairs, has addressed a circular despatch to the diplomatic representatives of France at the European Courts, in regard to the existing relations of the Government with other Continential powers. Alluding to the recent events, particularly to the Conference held at Salseburg, M. Moustier declares that this auspicious meeting of the Emperors of France and Austria should be regarded as a fresh pledge for the maintenance of peace in Europe.

LONDON, Sept. 2. - In a circular note the Sublime Porte announces to its Ministers at Foreign Courts that the war in the Island of Candia has been brought to a close, and that a general amnesty has been granted to the insurgents.
