ONTARIO AND QUEBEC.—An Ottawa telegram of the 23d, says that there are further interesting developments in the Whelan case. Two detectives gave a sworn narrative of a conversation they overheard in goal between Whelan and Doyle, in which Whelan fully acknowledged shooting McGee.

The Journal says:—By private advice from Ottawa, Quebec, and Montreal, we learn that several public men and private citizens have received "warnings" of various kinds, growing out of the death of Mr. McGee and the prosecution of Whelan.

THE ASSASSINATION CASE.—The Montreal Witness gives the following condensed outline of Whelan's confession:—

The important testimony of Whelan's own confession, of his guilt, has been confirmed in Ottawa July, Whelan and Doyle are confined in adjoining cells, and their conversation, which, in his naked depravity, is not fit for publication, was overheard by two persons. Detective Cullen and a prisoner named Hess—although how the latter individual came to be listening at or near the door of Whelan's cell is not clearly shown. The avowal, "I shot that fellow—I shot him like a dog," was made with the recklessness of desperation. He seemed to glory in the fact that he was "a great fellow," and that "his name would go down to posterity." With equal brazen audacity, he professed to be indifferent whether he should "swing for it" or go to the penitentiary.

Accepting Whelan's own statement, he belongs to a bad family. One of his brothers was shot at the firing of the Tullough barracks in Ireland, one is in prison for being engaged in the same outrage, and he himself was also in prison for eighteen months, for Penismen, in the west of England. It must have been very gratifying to the detective, Cullen, to hear Whelan say in the course of this somewhat remarkable dialogue, "I saved Cullen's life at one time; a fellow had him covered at fifteen yards." On Monday, the 18th, Hess had a conversation with Doyle, in which the latter mentioned that Whelan, on the night of the murder, showed Doyle a revolver, and asked Doyle to accompany him to the House to hear McGee's last speech.
