MONTREAL, March 15.—Investigation in the Chalmers case was conducted this morning before the Judge of Sessions with closed doors.

Western line of Grand Trunk is again being impeded by drift snow. The Train due at Montreal this morning is belated, and at 3 p. m., to day was stuck in the snow at Lachine bank.

There are 230 passengers on board Judge Loranger and several of the passengers walked to Quebec; two other Judges, a deputation from Montreal Corporation and several M. P.'s are among those on board the train.

English barque, supposed to have been the *John Bright*, laden with lumber from Port Toronto for a South American port, was wrecked in Nootka Sound, February 4th, and all on board are supposed to have been lost.

The barque, *Harcourt Queen*, from Humboldt Bay for San Francisco, February 17th, is supposed to have been foundered at sea with all on board.
