Notwithstanding any thing contained in the twelfth section of an Act made and passed in the twenty second year of the reign of her present Majesty, called the "Saint John City Assessment Act of 1859," the value of all Real and Personal Estate and Joint Stock shall be deemed and taken to be, and shall be put down at two fifths of the actual worth thereof, instead of one fifth, as mentioned in said twelfth section.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the thirteenth section of said recited Act, the Mortgagee, if resident in the City of Saint John, within the meaning of the Assessment Laws relating to said City, shall be assessed on the amount of his Mortgage; and the Mortgagor shall in such cases be relieved from assessment on so much of the value of the Real Estate as shall be so assessed upon the Mortgagor.
