**Household.**  
**BEEF SOUP.**—Crack the bone of a shin of beef and put on to boil in as many quarts of cold water as there are pounds of meat; add a teaspoonful of salt for each quart; simmer slowly, at first, skimming as often as any scum arises; let boil two hours, then add four large onions sliced; two carrots, scraped and sliced; one root of celery cut into small pieces—or a teaspoonful of celery salt. When the vegetables and meat are done, strain the soup and return to the kettle, adding a teaspoonful of rice for each quart, and boil until tender add pepper and salt to taste. If the soup is preferred clear, omit the rice and thicken with a very little flour and water. A shin of veal is nice for soup, but it should be soaked in cold water an hour before using

**MINNEHAHA CAKE.**—One and a half cups granulated sugar, half cup butter stirred to a cream, whites of six eggs or three whole eggs, two teaspoonfuls cream tartar, put into two heaping cups of flour and both sifted together, one teaspoonful soda in half cup of sweet milk. Bake the cake in three layers. For filling take a tea-cup of sugar and a little water; boil together until brittle when dropped into cold water; remove from the stove and stir quickly into the well beaten white of one egg; add to this a cup of stoned raisins, chopped fine; or a cup of chopped hickory nut-meats, and place between layers and over the top of the cake.

**TO STOP THE NOSE-BLEED.**—A recent writer says that the best remedy for bleeding at the nose consists in the vigorous motion of the jaws, as in the act of mastication. In the case of a child a wad of paper should be placed in its mouth, and the child should be instructed to chew it hard.
