**Household.**  
**CLEANING SILK.**—White or light silk may be cleaned by rubbing it on both sides with Indian meal, and carefully dusting it with a bit of silk or a fine handkerchief. The same process may be used on kid gloves.

**SELECTED RECIPES.**—Two teaspoonfuls of finely powdered charcoal, drank in a half tumbler of water, will often give relief to the sick headache, when caused, as in most cases it is, by a superabundance of acid on the stomach.

Horseradish will afford instantaneous relief in most obstinate cases of hoarseness. The root, of course, possesses the most virtue, though the leaves are good till dry, when they lose their strength. The root is best when it is green. The person who will use it freely just before beginning to speak, will not be troubled with hoarseness.

**TO RESTORE ALPACA AND MERINO.**—Sponge the right side with clear cold coffee, which has been strained through a piece of black calico or muslin (a bit of black muslin is better than a sponge to dampen with) and iron with a hot iron immediately on the wrong side: it will "look as good as new."—*Boston Journal of Chemistry.*

**MUFFINS.**—To five ounces of flour (or half a pint), use half pint of milk, half teaspoonful of yeast powder, a pinch of salt, two eggs and an ounce and a half of butter. Mix the flour and butter well together in a bowl and then add the salt when smooth, introduce the yeast powder, and work in the two eggs. Mix in from the sides a little dry flour and then add the milk, beating the flour, etc., well together. The more it is beaten or mixed, the nicer the muffins will be. Grease the muffin rings, and heat them slightly. Pour the mixture into the centre of the rings and cook in a quick oven for ten minutes.

**Sleep as a Medicine.**  
 A physician says that the cry for rest has always been louder than the cry for food. Not that it is more important, but it is often harder to obtain. The best rest comes of sound sleep. Of two men or women otherwise equal, the one who sleeps the better, will be more healthy and efficient. Sleep will do much to cure irritability of temper, peevishness and uneasiness. It will restore vigor to an over-worked brain. It will build up and make strong a weak body. It will cure a headache. It will cure a broken spirit. It will cure sorrow. Indeed we might make a long list of nervous and other maladies that sleep will cure. The cure of sleeplessness requires a clean, good bed, sufficient exercise to promote weariness, pleasant occupation, good air, and not too warm a room, a clear conscience, an avoidance of stimulants and narcotics. For those who are overworked, haggard, nervous, who pass sleepless nights, we commend the adoption of such habits as will secure sleep.—*The Baptist.*

**Sudden Deaths of Business Men.**  
 Bishop Simpson, of the M. E. Church, speaking at the funeral service of Dr. Nelson, referred to the number of venerable fathers in the church who had been taken away during not many years past. Then he said—and we pray that the lesson may not be lost—"I am reminded by these scenes of the fact that in these days men of business seem to die so easily. It may be a fancy, but it appears to me there is not that warning there was years ago. Such is the pressure of business on the brain, and such is the wear of nerve in the active conflict of life, that the men break down suddenly. They seem unable to resist disease, and we hear almost every day of men dropping suddenly, with scarcely a moment's warning. Death is abroad; the messenger is touching all around us, and we almost feel as though he were about to touch us also. How soon we shall be in the casket none of us but the All-wise can tell. The lesson is that which death always utters—to be ever ready; to have our work done."
