Temperance.

Dominion Alliance.

Many friends of temperance in Canada have long felt the want of a compact or ganization, in which all their strength could be united and harmonized, and by which could be secured a surer and larger financial support for the promotion of the work than has yet been obtained. The Dominion Alliance has been formed to supply the want. Being devoted exclusively to the legal aspects of the temperance work, the Alliance claims to be in perfect harmony with all other temperance organizations, endeavoring to supplement their efforts in the moral aspect of the work, and seeking to centralize and combine all with a view to securing legislation and organized opposition to the liquor

The relation of society to the liquor raffic involves questions demanding much more than an occasional burst of enthusi astic interest. Constant agitation and education are necessary, and must be steadily sustained to ensure success.

The Dominion Alliance is composed of those persons who favor its principles and contribute to its funds. The constitution provides for additional branches and local auxiliaries. Each branch makes its own by-laws and rules for the government of auxiliaries within the province and determines the amount of contribution neces sary to entitle to membership. The provincial branches (by their executives) are expected to render efficient aid by discussing, maturing and earrying out plans or work, to which end lecturing and organiz. ing agents must be employed, literature bearing upon the movement published and circulated, contests under the Canada Temperance Act encouraged and aided, and other efforts in harmony with the objects of the Alliance put forth. Such work cannot be done without funds. It is, therefore, of the greatest moment that appeals should be immediately made throughout the different provinces to secure as large a paying membership as possible, as well as larger contributions from those blessed with the means. Unless such come to our assistance the work cannot be carried on upon a scale commensurate with its im- articles.

The general executive of the Alliance is sonable time for payments.

Parties ordering by mail can rely upon getting as fine an instrument as if personally selected by themselves. Any Organ or Plano not found exactly as repeated can be returned to us at our expense. We and direct the co-operation of the various provinces in general and inter-provincial work. It engages no agents, pays no salaries-its expenses being incidentals to be provided for by an assessment on the vari ous provincial branches.

The Rev. Tho. Gales, of Montreal, Corresponding Secretary of the Alliance has aignified his willingness to devote himself during the ensuing year to the public advocacy of the principles and work of the Alliance, wherever his services are needed and suitable arrangements can be made Mr. Gales will co-operate with the various provincial executives, those bodies having exclusive control of agency and financial work within the several provinces in which branches exist.
