Excerpt from a sermon by Rev. A. A. Cameron, pastor of the Baptist Church, Ottawa, on the Sabbath succeeding the grand ball in Rideau Hall:

Well, the guests are all assembled; Government House is in a blaze of glory! What Canadian eye ever saw such a scene of splendor. Hark! the music swells its notes of joy, of welcome, of mirth, a thousand beating hearts are responding, and hundreds of tripping feet are moving, as though at the touch of the graces. What poetry and harmony of sound and motion. On with the dance! Beauty has multiplied her charms to night. Fashion never appeared so fashionable. Men and woman—yea, ministers and their wives—are intoxicated with the joy of the hour. Pleasure holds its revel. Care is drowned in mirth; sighs are swept away in the tide of song and gaiety. Cigarettes.

A very great number of boys who would not think of using a pipe or a cigar, will buy and smoke cigarettes. A doctor in England lately, because he saw so many boys smoking, began to see if it was not injuring them. He examined thirty-seven boys between the ages of nine and fifteen, and in twenty-seven cases, smoking had already done great harm. Twelve had frequent bleeding at the nose, ten had disturbed sleep, twelve had ulceration of the mucous membrane of the mouth, and twenty-two had various disorders of circulation and digestion, and a marked taste for strong drink. Boys, don't smoke! It spoils your nerves, makes your breath bad, makes it not half as pleasant for your mothers and sisters to kiss you, and will gradually, as a rule, weaken your minds as well as your bodies.

Household.

REPAIRING RUBBER OR LEATHER GOODS.—Pure rubber cut into thin strips and dissolved in benzine as strong as 85 to 95 per cent, makes a superior composition for repairing rubber or leather goods. The leather should be scraped thoroughly, exposing a rough surface, apply the composition to both parts. The benzine evaporates, leaving the parts firmly glued together; rubber soles may be attached to rubber boots, and worn without loosening. If more is dissolved than what is wanted at once, it may be dissolved again.

CHICAGO PUFFS.—Four cups of flour, four cups of new milk, four eggs, butter the size of a walnut; beat it as light as possible. Bake in cups about twenty-five minutes.

PUFF CAKE.—Three cupfuls of flour, three eggs, two cups of white sugar, one cup of milk one cup of butter, two teaspoonfuls of cream of tartar and one spoonful of soda.

GOLD CAKE.—The yolks of five eggs, one cup of sugar, one cup rich cream, one teaspoonful of soda, a pinch of salt, two cups of flour; season with vanilla.
