Temperance.

A MEDICAL REMEDY.—The celebrated and zealous John Vine Hall, of England, the father of Dr. Newman Hall, the great London minister, was in his younger days a great drunkard, and his efforts to become released from the bondage of his appetite were very great. He says he found the following preparation of much service at times of his strong cravings: Sulphate of iron, 5 grains; magnesia, 10 grains; peppermint water, 11 drachms; spirits of nutmeg, 1 drachm. This he took twice or three times a day. Others may try it.

No sensible friend of temperance proposes to make prohibitory laws take the place of moral agencies. All that is claimed for law is that it supplements and strengthens moral agencies and fortifies and holds the ground that they have gained. How TAXES ARE RAISED.—An exchange says: We license men to sell liquor. We pretend that restricts its use. Then every single person that wants any, goes and gets it. Some of them get noisy and dangerous. We put our hands into the citizen's pocket and take out some money and pay policemen to look out for these fellows. We put our hands in again and take out another handful and build a prison and court rooms and buy a state farm. Then it does seem as though we might be left alone for a little while. But pretty soon, haggard woman and children come to us to supply the wants that should have been supplied by the licensed liquor seller's victim. Then we put our hand in the citizen's pocket again, and take out some more money and buy these wretched ones some coal and a little meal and they are saved from starvation. By this time the citizen begins to look sober. His own family need the money that has gone to help pay the result of the liquor traffic. We pity the citizen. We talk sympathetically with him about the "hard times;" but we neglect to tell him that in his vote he holds a power that is mighty to change all things.

Household.

SNOW-DRIFT CAKE.—Two cups powdered sugar; one heaping cup prepared flour; ten eggs—the whites only, whipped stiff; juice of one lemon and half the grated peel; a little salt. Whip the eggs stiff, beat in the sugar, lemon, salt, and finally the flour. Stir in very lightly and quickly and bake at once in two loaves, or in square cards. It is a beautiful and delicious cake when fresh. It is very nice, baked as a jelly-cake and spread with this: FILLING.—Whites of three eggs; one heaping cup of powdered sugar; juice of one orange and half the peel; juice of half a lemon. Whip to a good meringue and put between the layers, adding more sugar for the frosting on the top.

FAVORITE MEAT PIE.—Take cold roast beef, or roast meat of any kind, slice it thin, cut it rather small, and lay it, wet with gravy and sufficiently peppered and salted, in a meat-pie dish. If liked, a small onion may be chopped fine and sprinkled over it. Over the meat pour a couple of stewed tomatoes, a little more pepper, and a thick layer of mashed potatoes. Bake slowly in a moderate oven till the top is a light brown.

FOR TAKING OUT SCORCH.—If a shirt-bosom or any other article has been scorched by ironing, lay it where bright sun will fall directly on it. It will take it entirely out.

MILDEWED LINEN.—To remove mildew soap the linen previously wetted, and apply salt and lemon juice to both sides; or apply finely powdered pipe-clay, or fuller's-earth, or finely powdered chalk. Expose it for several hours to the atmosphere.
