Temperance.

Modes of Action.

Hon. B. Gratz Brown in the National Prohibitionist: The power of the printed page so far transcends any personal speech, in these days of universal reading, that any comparison would be futile. When the strongest array of facts, the cogent reasoning, possible persuasion that melts into pathos, or ringing sentences that leap electric from point to point in the argument, can all be compassed in a form and struck off by the hundred thousand, and transmitted in a day to the people of a whole State, what voice even though of syren or saint, can hope to compete with its influence. And this power of print, wonderful as it now seems, is only at its beginning; for invention is already rife with methods of rendering it vocal as human speech, instant as photography, and infinite in reproduction. Facts are what the world wants to see in print, and facts are short, sturdy things, just fit to put in print. Opinions are of value only as they hold facts in solution. Your moving eloquence are but facts on fire. Iteration, too, and reiteration are essential. Facts which come throug the eye are more permanent, when fixed, than those got through the ear; yet like telegrams, they require to be repeated to make sure. In a right cause, the printed page in its rapidity of reach and results will be past belief. It is with such weapons that reforms are waged. Multiply impressions and effects become cumulative. Scatter a few score of these documents in the by-ways where the wrong is being brooded over, and soon there will be a neighborhood in a blaze. Feed the flame, extend the circle, spread the papers, and in six months a county will be ready to vote no license. But to educate needs attention, and to secure attention, there must be agitation. A good way to start agitation is to make the issue of prohibition on the county judge, or introduce an ordinance having a stiff bit of imprisonment in it. Either will command the situation. Dram selling is already a crime by law, except it be licensed. Make it also a crime in social esteem by sending the liquor dealer to jail.

Print is at its cheapest. And the amount of invaluable publication, to be had by the poorest, fully equals his time to peruse it. When the National Prohibitionist is sent the year long for a dollar, it requires a calculating machine to fix the minimum of price paid for every right word said in it. When a dram costs more than one million printed words, the printed page is sure to subdue the saloon.

It is the belief of those who know, that the price of a yoke of oxen, spent in circulating a thorough prohibition paper will revolutionize any country not controlled by a central city. B. GRATZ BROWN.

Original Advice to Drinkers.

Barkeepers in this city pay to an average \$2 per gallon for whiskey. One gallon contain an verage of sixty-five drinks, and at ten cents a drink, the poor man pays \$6.50 per gallon for his whiskey. In other words, he pays \$2 for the whiskey and \$4.50 to a man for handing it over the bar. / Make your wife your barkeeper. By the time you have drunk a gallon she will have \$6.50, or enough money to refund the \$2 borrowed of you, to pay for another gallon of liquor, and have a balance of \$2.50. Kousehold.

FOR CHAPPED HANDS .- Pour a little of the best cider vinegar in the palm of the hands and rub them together well with it.

GREEN TOMATO PRESERVES .- Eight pounds small green tomatoes. Pierce each with a fork; seven pounds sugar; four lemons-the juice only; one ounce ginger and mace mixed. Heat all together slowly, and boil until the fruit is clear. Take it from the kettle in a perforated skimmer, and spread upon dishes to cool. Boil the syrup thick. Put the fruit into jars and cover with hot syrnp.

MACARONI WITH EGGs. -Break a half a pound of macaroni into short bits; cook tender in boiling, salted water. Drain well, put into a deep dish and pour over it a cupful of drawn butter in which have been stirred two beaten eggs, and two tablespoonfuls of grated cheese, with salt and pepper. Loosen the macaroni to allow the sauce to penetrate the mass. Pass more grated cheese with it.

I to Timely Hints.

Sow your wheat and oats as soon as the ground will harrow dry, the earlier the better. However, never harrow unless the dust flies

Remember the wheat requires a well beaten soil, therefore harrow well and then roll heavily. A clod crusher does better generally than the smooth roller.

Grass seed should be brushed in, or harrowed in with a light harrow. Sow them before the drought sets in. a particulate
