



address must be based on incontrovertible truth-God's word declares with eloquent power (Ezek. xxx: iii.) "If the watchman see the sword come, and blow not " the trumpet, and the people be not warned, if the " sword come and atake any person from among them, "he istaken way in his iniquity, his blood, will I require at the Watchman's hand!"

The church of Christ is "per se' God's watchman. Around us we see the curse of intemperance sweeping 60,000 souls annually to a drunkard's doom. Their ranks are replenished from a standing army of half a million inebriates in our land. Around us, the wails of countless widows and orphans, of heart broken wives and wretched trembling little ones are piercing heavens with cries, less for vengeance than for protection and deliverance from that curse of earth's curses which has robbed their desolate home of parent, brother or child, tarnished their name and left them a boundless legacy of misery, poverty and woe.
