The Maine Law.

The following testimony, from the returned nissionary, Dr. Cyrus Hamlin, Bangor, will be read with interest by our subscribers:

"Maine being my native state, and not having resided in it for forty years, my return to it one year ago, led me to examine the Maine law and its workings with great interest. I have been through the state in various directions, from Kittery to Calais; have attended the public meetings in many of the counties, and have had intercourse with men who have known the State all their lives. I am prepared to main tain this proposition with regard to the Maine law: It is an incalculable blessing to all the real estate owners. It is the chief reason why the State has not been ruined in these hard

"1. It has almost fannihilated drunkennesamong the farmers. The farms have prospers ed, and buildings and roads have wonderfully improved throughout the State. The most intelligent men attribute this largely to the Maine law. In many farming towns you cannot get a drop of liquor for love or money.

"2 It is a boon to all manufacturers. Their men work better, produce more, and break and injure less. Manufacturers have told me that they could not get on successfully with rum shops around them, nor would they attempt it. It is nearly an equal blessing to the lumbermen.

" Now these embrace the bulk of the property of the State. As to crime, I found the jail of Oxford county empty, and I have been assured the same is often true of other counties. Pauperism is hardly known except in the cities. I enquired of a man how many paupers he had in his town, and he said there were none. There were people more or less poor, and there might be some so poor as to be helped by their friends. But a town paper would be a town disgrace. There are certain cities-Portland, Bangor, Lewiston, etc.—where this state of things is different. Cities will always have a class that will evade all law. The Maine law is to some extent evaded in the cities, and there is found most of the crime and pauperism. Rum is brought or smuggled in, in every possible way. Even there, however, the evil is diminished, and as a public sentiment becomes more sound, stronger measures will be resorted to. The whole rum-interest has fallen into the lowest and vilest class, who defy public sentiment, and like the thieves and tramps look only at what they can get without too much danger."

### Kousehold.

SUET PUDDING. One half cup of sweet milk. one-half cup molasses, one-half cup of raisins, one-half cup suet, one and three quarter cups of flour, one teaspoonful of soda. This makes a pudding large enough for eight persons. Steam three hours. It may be steamed Saturday, and warmed over hot water for dinner Sunday.

FLOWER-Pors .- Save the tin fruit-cans, and convert them into tasteful flower-pots in the following manner: With a can-opener cut off any rough or projecting portions of the cover. leaving a narrow rim to project inward. With a pair of pliers or a small hammer, bend this rim down. This gives firmness to the top of the can. Punch three or four small holes through the bottom of the can. Then paint it Daily expected to arrive ex Schooner "A. F. Ranwith varnish made of gum shellac dissolved in alcohol and colored with lamp-black and a little yellow ochre to give a dark brown color. The cans may be ornamented by pasting on them little medallion figures or pictures. They are handsomer than the ordinary flower-pots, require less watering, and keep the plants free from all insects, owing to the presence of iron rust in the can.

### When To Eat Fruit.

The Spanish proverb hand: "Fruit is golden in the morning, silver at noon, but lead at night." Americans do not seem to have heard of this proverb, nor to have one of their own experience. Mostly they eat fruit at night, and hence have not the sovereign idea of it they would have, if they had eaten it at proper times. They eat it as dessert at dinner. This may be the proper time to eat dried fruits but it is not the right time to eat juicy ones. The Spanish people learned their proverb from eating the very juicy fruits like oranges. These should be eaten in the morning, a little before dinnernot later than noon. Early in the day they will, if eaten, prove to be the best possible medicine for the bilious.

### American and French Breakfasts.

American housewives have not studied the art of cooking the various kinds of meat in the most economical and palatable modes. French cooks far excel us in this particular. They not only gather up the fragments, as the Scriptures enjoin, so that nothing may be lost," but they make it a study to cook every part of the animal in the most attractive and nutritious mode. A hook bone, with their skilful manipulation, will make a delicious dinner for a large family, and they will save stock enough, while the addition of a variety of cheap vegetables, to make a nutritious soup for the next day's dinner. Americans want beefsteak for breakfast; a Frenchman is content with a boiled egg, a hot roll and a cup of coffee. The Frenchman's breakfast costs five to ten cents, the American's twenty-five to fifty cents, and the former is just as nutritious as the latter, and more easily digested. Dyspepsia, the fashionable disease of America, is seldom known in France.
