Temperature. Canon Farrar, not long ago, addressing a Friends' meeting upon temperance, thus referred to the influence of one of their body: "It was William Mackin who had the honor of converting to this cause Theobald Mathew, he (William Mackin) being also a member of the Society of Friends. Theobald Mathew was working hard as a Roman Catholic priest among the degraded population of Cork, and one day, on William Mackin visiting the hospital, he saw a sight--which you may see any day in any London hospital--the sight of numbers brought there by the appalling diseases and brutal violence of drink--and turning around to the young Catholic priest, with his heart stirred within him, he said: 'Oh, Theobald Mathew, what mightest thou not do if thou wouldst take part in this great work?' Young Mathew thought of it. For several days it was in his mind; for several nights it kept him almost sleepless, and at last, after long prayer, he came to the determination, and rising up, said the words which have since become so memorable: 'Here goes, in the name of God!' That was how Theobald Mathew--guided, influenced, converted to the cause by a member of the Society of Friends--began a crusade which, for the time being, did much to cripple the whiskey trade in Ireland and which was carried also to England, and gave the first stimulus to the work in which we are engaged. It was accidentally through him (Father Mathew) that Dr. Guthrie became an abstainer. You know he was being driven in a part of Ireland one very rainy day, and he went into a public house to get a little whiskey, under the mistaken notion (which is not even dispelled yet), that thereby he could keep out the cold. He said to the poor drenched car-driver, 'Won't you come and take something?' He replied, 'Thank you, I won't touch a single drop of it.' 'Why is that?' said Dr. Guthrie. He had taken the pledge from Father Mathew. Dr. Guthrie, thinking over it, considered that he was a poor, uneducated peasant who was strong enough to resist temptation because he saw it would lead to his own ruin, and Dr. Guthrie thought that if the car-driver was strong enough to exercise that resolution he ought to be. Thus it was that he became an abstainer, and carried on the work in Scotland, and through him thousands in England and Scotland carried it on also. Therefore you are obliged, as members of this society, not only by the general traditions of the body to which you belong, but also by their special influence in this particular work in the past, to promote it."

The present crusade against the socialists in various European governments rises the very important question of the "right of asylum" as accorded by certain liberal governments, such as Switzerland, England and the United States. These countries have, for many years, been as the "cities of refuge" of old, and the question now raised is: Can they continue to afford a retreat to vicious malcontents who are driven out of other communities because of their dangerous character? As long as this question was merely a political one, liberal governments did not for a moment waver as to their duty; but since it has of late become one in which the common safety of society is concerned, and all our social blessings and privileges are at stake, the most liberal minds hesitate as to the duty of accepting such men in our midst and protecting them. The moment it was clear that the Prussian government intended to proceed seriously with the socialists of Berlin, and bade them begone at the risk of their personal liberty, Dr. Thompson, the eminent American divine, now located there--raised the warning voice to our authorities on this side of the water, and bade them consider the question of harboring these dangerous men, who, doubtless, in numbers, would make this country their future stamping-ground.
