Sabbath School.
BIBLE LESSONS.
FROM PELOUBETS' SELECT NOTES.
Third Quarter.
Lesson 4.—July 27. 2 Sam. 9: 1-13.

KINDNESS TO JONATHAN'S SON.
GOLDEN TEXT.
Thine own friend, and thy father's friend, forsake not.—Prov. 27: 10.
1. Is there yet any. Saul's sons had died with him in the battle of Gilboa; and few of his descendants were left. David probably had never heard of the existence of Mephibosheth. At Saul's death the child was only five years old, and David had then been an exile about six years. His lameness (chap. 4: 4) had prevented him from taking any part in the public contests of the time. *House of Saul.* Whence he had received great unkindness. Saul had sought his life; Ishbosheth had set up a rival kingdom; Michal had recently scorned his religious joy. Only Jonathan had acted well. *That I may show him kindness for Jonathan's sake.* In fulfilment of his oath to Jonathan (see 1 Sam. 20: 14-17, 42). The seeds of friendship sown by Jonathan now produce fruit.

2. A servant, or slave. The obscurity in which Mephibosheth had been kept is further shown by the fact that those of whom the king inquired were unable to give him the information he desired. They knew, however, of one Ziba, an old and trusted servant of Saul, now a prosperous man with 15 sons and 20 servants, and supposed that he could inform the king.
3. *That I may show the kindness of God.* A reference to Jonathan's words (1 Sam. 20: 14-15). Some take this to be kindness or mercy such as God shows to men. Others, kindness shown in God and for God's sake (Luke 6: 36). Others, a very great kindness, an everlasting kindness (Rom. 11: 29). And yet others undertake to combine all three ideas. "Kindness shown from indwelling in God will be pure and great kindness such as God shows." *A son, which is lame,* from his fall (chap. 4: 4). And therefore to be pitied. David could hope for no practical return of kindness from one so hopelessly infirm.

4. A man of wealth and position, of the tribe of Manasseh (Num. 32: 39, 43), and living near Mahanaim, east of the Jordan and north of the Jabbok. He may have taken charge of Mephibosheth at Jonathan's death. David reaped the fruit of his kindness to Mephibosheth, for when he fled from Absalom, Machir the son of Ammiel, was one of those who were most liberal in providing him and his army with necessaries (17: 27-29).

5. *David sent and fetched him.* He did not summon but kindly brought him.
6. *Behold thy servant.* This may be a merely oriental expression of courtesy (compare the address of Joseph's brethren to Pharaoh, Gen. 47: 3); or it may seem to confirm the views some hold of the abject spirit of the man.
7. *Fear not.* Mephibosheth might be afraid that David had only hunted him out to treat him after the common fashion of oriental usurpers,

who often put all their predecessor's kindred to death. He seems to have lived in concealment at Lo-debar. *Thou shalt eat bread at my table.* A common mark of honor in oriental countries (see 1 Kings 2: 7; 2 Kings 25: 29).
8. *He bowed himself.* The same Hebrew word as "did reverence" in ver. 6. *A dead dog* (1 Sam. 24: 14; 17: 43). "A dead dog" is an object of universal loathing and contempt. Extravagant expressions of humility, etc., are very common in the East, but this expression of Mephibosheth's is painfully servile, even when judged by an oriental standard.
9. *Ziba, Saul's servant.* One view held is, that Ziba was here summoned from the independent position he had held since Saul's death, and in which he had acquired his wealth, and remanded to his former condition of servitude. In this fact some find the motive for his conduct during the times of Absalom's rebellion (chap. 16: 3). But Josephus calls him one of Saul's freedmen. The difference this would make in Ziba's position would only be that instead of paying to David, he would have to pay them to Mephibosheth. *All that pertained to Saul.* Saul's family estate, which had fallen to David in right of his wife (Num. 27: 8), or been forfeited to the crown by Ishbosheth's rebellion (chap. 12: 8), was provided (ver. 11, also chap. 19: 28) for enabling him to maintain an establishment suitable to his rank, and Ziba appointed steward to manage it, on the condition of receiving one-half of the produce in remuneration of his labor and expense, while the other moiety was to be paid as rent to the owner of the land (chap 19: 20).
10. *Shall bring in the fruits.* The "bring" is to be understood of storing into barns, or also of delivery at Jerusalem. *Thy master's son.* "Son" here is equivalent to "grandson" as (ver. 7) "father" to "grandfather." *Shall eat bread . . . at my table.* Though Mephibosheth himself was to be a guest at the royal table, he would require the revenues of this estate for the support of his family and household. *Ziba had fifteen sons and twenty servants.* He could not have been a young man, nor a poor man.
Mephibosheth had a young son whose name was Micha. Whether born before or after his residence in Jerusalem cannot be ascertained. But through him the name and memory of the excellent Jonathan was preserved (see 1 Chron. 8: 34, 35; 9: 40, 41).
13. *Dwell in Jerusalem.* Not on his estate for two reasons. (1) He was David's guest; (2) his lameness required attention.
