Sabbath School. BIBLE LESSONS. FROM PELOUBETS' SELECT NOTES. Second Quarter. Lesson 6.—May 11. I Cor. 15: 50-55. VICTORY OVER DEATH.

Death is swallowed up in victory.—1 Cor. 15: 54. 50. This verse is the summing up of Paul's instruction in the preceding verses, in regard to the nature of the resurrection body.

51. I show you a mystery. This mystery was, that those who are alive at the coming of the Lord will experience a change that shall fit them for participating in the kingdom of God.

52. In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye. Both these expressions indicate the same thing, and set forth in a most striking manner the instantaneousness of the transition.

53. This corruptible must put on incorruption. The new body will be both spiritual and immortal. This verse implies a continuance of personal identity in the whole man whatever change is asserted.

54. So when, etc. The argument closes in a burst of almost poetical fervor. The saying that is written, etc. (Isa. 25: 8; Hos. 13: 14) Death is swallowed up in victory.

55. O death, where is thy sting? The evils in death from which Christ sets us free are (1) the doubts and uncertainty in which a future state is involved; (2) the forbodings of punishment, proceeding from the consciousness of sin; (3) the fears that arise in the mind upon the awful transition from this world to the next.

57. Thanks be to God. For he alone could give the victory. Which giveth us the victory. The victory here meant is of course the victory over death and the grave.

58. Therefore. Because all this is so—because there is a life hereafter—let this life here be worthy of it. You might grow weak and faint-hearted if you could think that all your work for God and truth here might be wasted; but it is not so.
