THE KING'S BIRTHDAY.

Will be Observed in Canada

It has been decided that His Majesty's birthday on the 9th of November shall

be celebrated in the same manner as that of her late Majesty Queen Victoria in May.

It is ordained by the Interpretation Acts that the sovereign's birthday shall throughout all British dominions be observed as a public holiday. Inquiries at the banks and leading mercantile establishments in Montreal elicited the reply that the would all be closed on that day.

There had been talk of observing the King's birthday on the 24th of May instead of on the date of the anniversary of his birth, on account of the weather being more favorable in the merry month than in November in countries like Great Britain and Canada, which are situated in northern latitudes. It was found that this could not be legally done even had the sovereign himself expressed a desire to make a departure so unusual.

The weather in London in November is usually dismal enough, but in Australia on the other hand it is delightful—it is the month in which the spring is giving place to the early summer, and the sun has not assumed the intensity of the summer solstice.

In Canada it is no unusual thing to experience genial days in the early part of November. The railway companies are all preparing to handle a heavy traffic on the new holiday.

A Hamburg school-teacher recently undertook to find out what his pupils knew about common things. Out of 120 children between 10 and 16 years of age, 58 had never seen a flock of sheep, 70 had never seen a violet growing, 90 had never heard a high ingale, 89 had never seen the sun rise and 33 had not seen it set, 49 had never seen a man plough.
