

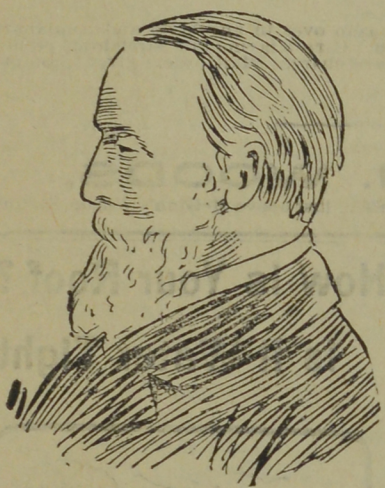
PROFESSOR VIRCHOW

HELD IN GERMANY AS THE GREATEST
OF LIVING SCIENTISTS.

One of the Few Scientists Who Have Taken
an Interest in the Affairs of His Fel-
lowmen in Religion and Politics—
Birthday Gifts to the Savant, Includ-
ing Decoration From the Kaiser.

Professor Rudolph Virchow, the eightieth anniversary of whose birth was on the 12th, was celebrated on the 12th and 13th October, is held by many persons to be the greatest of living scientists. The aged pathologist has not, however, spent his entire time in the laboratory. He is one of the few great men of science who have taken a living and active part in the concerns of his fellow-men, religious and political. Virchow has had a stormy life outside of his scientific workshop. He is claimed to have been the originator of the celebrated phrase "kultur-kampf," used to describe the anti-church movement of politics in Germany. His most earnest supporter in this cult has been Ernst Haeckel, the famous Jena biologist. Virchow is the inventor of cellular pathology. His works made up a small library of books upon pathological and political subjects. He has never wandered very far from Berlin, the home of his student days and the scene of his educational labors since 1856. Herr Virchow was born at Schivelbein, in Pomerania, in 1821, and is one of the most patriotic of Germans.

At the birthday banquet tendered Professor Virchow on the 12th Oct. in Berlin, Professor Waldeyer, secretary of the Academy of Science, presented him with 50,000 marks sub-

scribed by the medical men of Germany to increase the endowment of the Virchow Institute.

Dr. Studt announced that Emperor William had conferred upon Professor Virchow the great gold medal of science, and read the Emperor's letter accompanying the decoration, which said in part:

"You have broken new ground, and laid fresh foundations for medical science. Your name is written boldly upon the tablets of history, and is honored far beyond the borders of the fatherland."

The King of Italy sent Professor Virchow a gold medalion bearing a portrait of himself.

Professor Virchow's laboratories at Berlin and his lectures in his capacity of university professor there have long been the medical student's goal from every part of the world. When he was but twenty-six he was appointed a professor in Berlin University. He was sent almost immediately by the Prussian Government to fight a widespread outbreak of typhus in Silesia. Combative by nature and an ardent reformer, he was fired with the enthusiasm of 1848, and threw himself ardently into politics. This cost him his university post, and a paper he started, called The Medical Reformer, was suppressed by the authorities. Wurzburg, however, offered him a chair in its faculty, and here during some years he pursued his researches upon the cellular tissues, gave brilliant lectures and advocated medical reforms. In a few years he was recalled to Berlin, but he did not relinquish his political aims, and in 1863 he was leader of the Liberal

Exposition. This brought him into collision with no less a person than Bismarck, who challenged him to a duel after Virchow had managed to defeat the Prussian Ministry's proposals for the creation of a navy. He resigned his seat in Parliament in 1878, but his frank expression of ultra-Liberal views brought about his dismissal from the rectorship of the university in 1887.

His best known writings deal with cholera (1848-9), typhoid fever, trichinosis (1860), typhus in Hungary in 1868 and the pathology of tumors. Though subsequent investigations have shown some of his positions to be untenable, or to require modification, scientists are fully agreed as to the great merit and value of his life work.

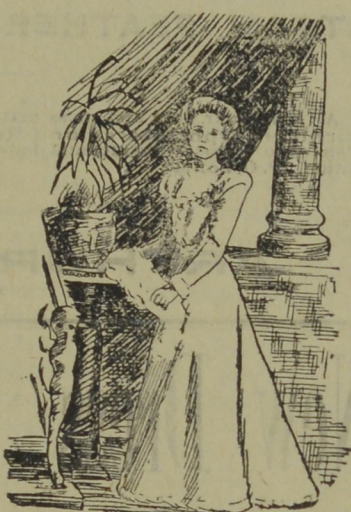
A Story of Debs by Debs.

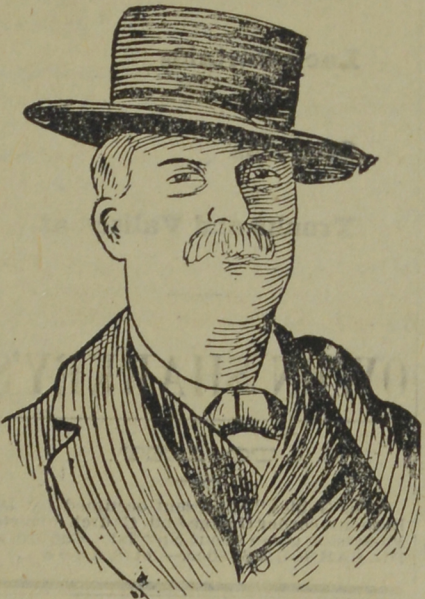
