Appreciative Sketch of a Former Well Known Fredericton Lady.

This week the sympathies of all the mothers in Canada have gone out to Mrs. A. G. Blair, wife of the Minister of Railways and Canals, over the loss of her daughter, who was drowned under such tragic circumstances at Ottawa. Mrs. Blair comes of a highly intellectual family. Her father was the late George Thompson, assistant Superintendent of Education at Fredericton, N. B. Her brother is Mr. A. S. Thompson, playwright and journalist. It was in Fredericton in 1866 that Miss Annie Thompson became the wife of Mr. A. G. Blair, who that same year was called to the bar. Since 1878, when her husband was elected to the Local House, Mrs. Blair has lived in an atmosphere of politics, but as her husband's career has been a series of political successes, the atmosphere has been tinged with rose. The wife of the Premier of New Brunswick from '83 to '96, official prominence was not new to Mrs. Blair when in the last mentioned year she came to Ottawa as the wife of a Cabinet Minister. Mrs. Blair loves books and pictures, but more than these she loves old china, and one of the most interesting things in the home of the Minister of Railways and Canals, is a collection of jugs and pitchers in china and Delft, representative of almost every age and country. Mrs. Blair has two sons, the death of her youngest a couple of years ago was a great grief to her and to this is added the recent heavy blow. She has five daughters, one of whom is Mrs. R. F. Randolph of Fredericton.

THE SMALLPOX SITUATION.

Government Approves of Proposition to Place Physicians on Trains to Vaccinate.

At a meeting of the provincial government, held at St. John yesterday, the government approved of the order in council suggested by the provincial board of health for the placing of medical officers on the trains at certain points in the provinces—Edmundston, McAdam and Fredericton Junction—to inspect passengers arriving in the province.

Two smallpox cases and one suspect were reported yesterday, in St. John. The two cases are J. N. Harvey and his three-month-old child, at 75 Hazen street. A young woman named McFarlane, who is employed in the house as maid, was vaccinated about five weeks ago. Later a rash developed. It was thought to have been from the vaccination and a physician was not called. On the visit of the physicians yesterday it was found that the young woman was now convalescent after smallpox. Mr. Harvey's case is a mild one but it is thought it will be hard on the infant.

Last night a suspect was reported at No. 109 Queen street a Mrs. Grier.

Dr. Bearsto, of Lakeville, Carleton Co. reports that the four children of Willard Jones, postmaster at Brookville, two miles from Lakeville, were suffering from smallpox. The malady was first noticed on Sunday.

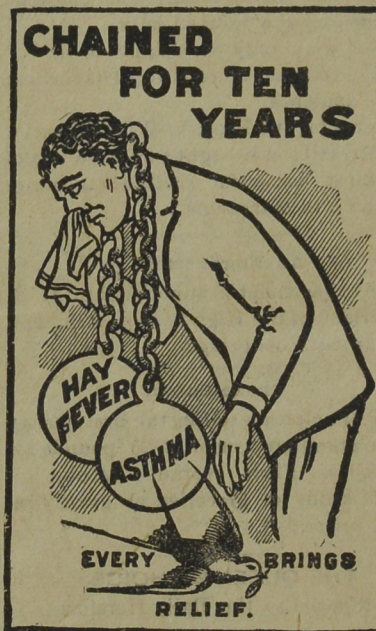
