SPENCERWOOD BLAZE.

Lieut.-Governor Jette and Premier Parent Helped to Subdue a Fire in a Piggery and Conservatory.

Quebec, Dec. 12.—The famous Spencerwood piggery building erected during the occupancy of the gubernatorial abode by the Lieutenant-Governor Robitaille, together with the conservatory of the public works department of the local Government, and the boiler house, and other buildings adjoining, which are close to the Lieutenant-Governor's residence, were destroyed by fire last night. The loss may amount to about \$8000, partially covered by insurance. A large number of companies divide up all the fire insurance of the Government and in case of fire the loss is also divided between them. The policy covers the building destroyed last night. The reflection of the fire and the reception of telephone messages for the fire brigade, shortly before nine o'clock, created considerable excitement in town, and as usual there were many exaggerated reports. Rumour had it that the main building was a prey to the flames, and hundreds of people from the city and the surrounding country including Bergerville and Sillery, rushed to the scene. One of the first to arrive was Premier Parent, who, as Mayor of Quebec, had immediately ordered the city fire brigade to the scene. The buildings erected as a piggery had not been used for that purpose since Mr. Robitaille's time. The conservatory destroyed is not that adjoining the Spencerwood residence, but one erected across the back yard of the premises some distance towards the west, a few years ago, by the Public Works Department, for providing flowers for the ornamentation of the Parliament grounds. Lt.-Gov. Jette was out superintending the efforts of the firemen, with Premier Parent, notwithstanding the inclemency of the weather. The firemen worked almost till midnight in extinguishing the flames, and at one time had great difficulty in preventing the extension of the fire to the stables, and thence to the Gubernatorial residence.
