Further, it must not be assumed that a person born abroad is never a natural born subject. The general common law rule is that persons born in British territory are natural born subjects; persons born out of it are aliens. The effect of certain Acts passed in the reigns of Anne, George II., and George III. was, however, to make the children and the grandchildren on the son's side of every man who by the common law was a British subject themselves natural born subjects, although born abroad.

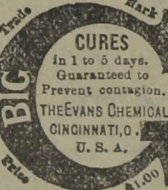

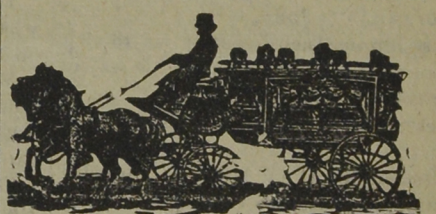
