

MURDER AT PUGWASH.

Drunken Hallowe'en Row Resulted in Terrible Crime.

Amherst, N. S. Nov 2.—Word was received here yesterday afternoon from Pugwash stating that a fatal stabbing affray took place there at 2 o'clock yesterday morning and as a result Charles McCauley is dead and John A. McCarthy is under arrest, charged with stabbing him.

It seems that a number of Pugwash young men were out celebrating hallowe'en, removing signs, gates and doors. Sandy McCauley, who keeps a butcher shop, decided to watch his premises to prevent any depredations, and as a consequence, his shop was open after midnight, and about eight or 10 congregated there.

They had evidently been drinking. A row started between Charles McCauley and McCarthy, which soon became general and in the melee McCauley was stabbed in the fleshy part of the right arm, almost severing it from the body.

The main artery was cut and McCauley was soon weakened from the great loss of blood, pools of which saturated the floor. Doctors McIntosh, Daken and Clay were summoned and remained with him during the balance of the night, doing all in their power.

Yesterday morning he was removed to his home. He gradually grew weaker and, about 5.30 yesterday afternoon, died. John A. McCarthy was placed under arrest on suspicion of being the party who inflicted the wound.

McCauley, the victim, was about 26 years of age and unmarried. John A. McCarthy, the prisoner, emigrated from England about 13 years ago. Last spring he removed to Pugwash and opened up a restaurant and grocery business. He has always been a good character, is about 25, and married.

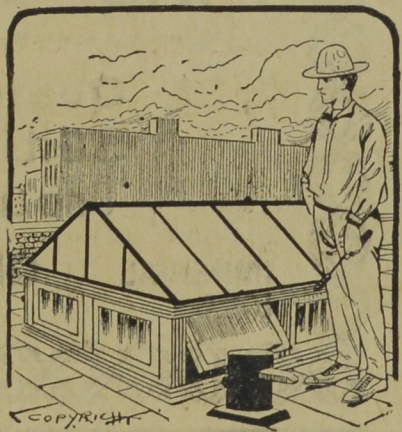
