The Man Up Town at the Telephone—Hello! Is this the grocer?

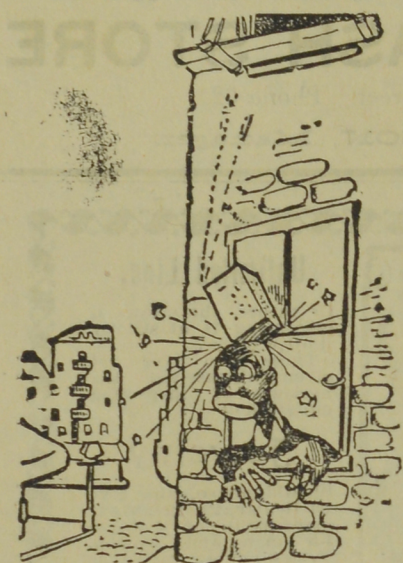
The Grocer—Yes.

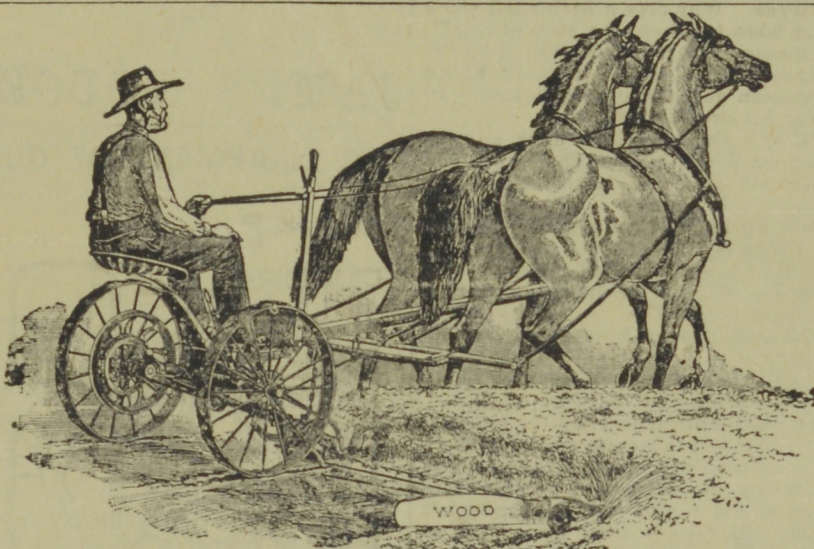
