

## MUCH BENEFIT TO CANADA.

Hon. Arthur Boyer Returns from  
Glasgow Exhibition.

IMPETUS GIVEN BY EXHIBITS AL-  
READY BEING FELT IN CER-  
TAIN TRADES.

Hon. Arthur Boyer, of Montreal, Canadian Commissioner to the Glasgow Exhibition who has returned home says that the exhibition is a splendid success in every way, and that Canada has a right to be proud of the prominence and excellence of her two groups of exhibits. He found that the deepest interest was excited in the productions of Canada and his office every mail had a great stack of letters making all sorts of inquiries, about their cost.

As to the prospects of increased trade Mr. Boyer said that a comparison of prices showed that there was in Scotland a great market for Canadian farm products. The prospects for manufactured articles were not as wide. It was found for example that certain lines of iron made articles could not compete with those of Scotch and English manufacture. With certain other lines, however, it was different. There was certain to be a large trade in carriages. As a result of the Canadian share in the exhibition a Toronto firm has now an order for carriages to be sent to Johannesburg, South Africa.

Mr. Boyer was sure that the result to Canada would prove a splendid and profitable advertisement. The average attendance was over 50,000, and on a few days it was over 120,000. These included a large number of small farmers, and he sure that there would be a considerable emigration of desirable settlers to Canada.
