

RESCUED FROM DEATH.

Awful Experience of a Couple of Springhill Miners.

Amherst, N. S., June 10.—Two men imprisoned for 40 hours in a damp, cold section of a coal mine, was the unenviable experience which John Merlin and Geo. Tipping, miners at Springhill, have had during Friday and Saturday and up to 4 o'clock Sunday morning.

It seems that, five men were at work clearing out an old slope in the Aberdeen section of the mines, working upwards from the bottom. About noon Friday, John Merlin and George Tipping worked their way up the steep incline for the purpose of taking out a battery so that the stone and debris would slide down the slope. They went so far as to be out of the hearing of their comrades below.

Soon afterwards thousands of tons of stone came down, blocking up the slope for a distance of 200 feet. The three men below were themselves shut in and got out with great difficulty.

There was little or no hope that Merlin and Tipping were alive, but as soon as the alarm was given, gangs of men were put to work to rescue them. About 4 o'clock Saturday morning it was found that they were imprisoned in an old head.

"Tap, tap" could at first be heard; then, getting nearer to them, the rescuers could hear them talking and were told that they were safe, but suffering with cold. They were only clad in thin working shirts and miners' pants. A constant drip of water from the ceiling of the old mine kept the place unusually cold and damp. Their lamps would last for only 12 hours, so that darkness added to their dreary position.

The rescuing party worked all through Friday night, Saturday and up to 4 o'clock Sunday morning, when their labors were rewarded by reaching the men, whom they found alive, but terribly cold and hungry, having had nothing to eat since 9 o'clock Friday morning.
