Martyr's Bones Returned.

The remains of King Edmund the Martyr, the last King of the East Angles, who reigned from 855 to 870, have been returned to England, after resting in France for more than 700 years. They reached Arundel in charge of Monsignore Del Val, Archbishop of Nicaea, Asia Minor, and were placed in the private chapel of the Duke of Norfolk pending final interment in the shrine being prepared for their reception in the new Roman Catholic cathedral in Westminster.

The body after burial at Hoxne was reinterred at Bury St. Edmunds, from which place it was carried off to France by Louis VII. Through the good offices and personal intervention of the Pope the relics are now returned to England.

Advice to Bathers.

The following hints about sea bathing have been issued to English bathers by the Royal Humane Society and are worth preservation:

Avoid bathing within two hours after a meal.

Do not invite chills by remaining on the beach or in the boat in the wet bathing costume.

Do not remain in the water after a feeling of chilliness comes.

Bathe when the body is at a normal temperature, neither overheated nor chilled.
