

BURNED WOMAN BY CARBOLIC ACID.

Two Heavily Veiled Females Attack the Beautiful Housekeeper of a Middle-town, N. H., Hotel.

Middletown, N. H., May 25.—Two women threw carbolic acid, yesterday, in the face of Nellie Taylor, housekeeper in the columbus hotel, disfiguring her for life.

Miss Taylor, who was a beautiful woman, went into the yard in the rear of the hotel for the purpose of taking her pet dog from its kennel into the hotel.

As she bent over to unfasten the chain holding the dog she was seized by two women, who were heavily veiled. One of them grasped her by the throat, while the other seized her by the arms and bore her to the ground. Then one of her assailants produced a vial of a mixture of carbolic acid and oil of cedar, and started to pour it over the helpless woman's face.

When the first few drops of the liquid struck her face Miss Taylor threw up her arms and knocked the bottle from her assailant's grasp, but not until enough of the acid had been poured on her to burn one side of her face, her neck and breast in a frightful manner.

The veiled woman escaped. Miss Taylor is suffering great pain, but will recover. Two motives are suggested for the crime. One is jealousy, and the other that it may have been committed by former employees of the hotel, whom Miss Taylor had discharged.

SWALLOWED HIS FALSE TEETH.

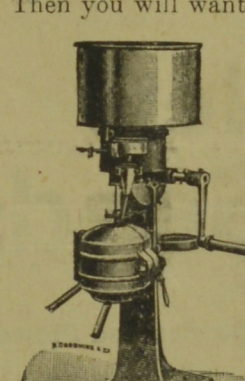

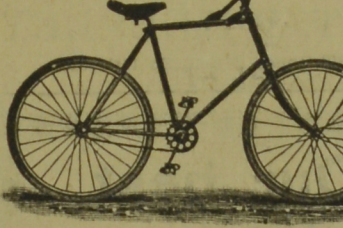


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
