Annual Matches of the Y.
C.R.A. Held at Stanley

SPLENDID WORK BY A. E. MASSIE OF THIS CITY.

Had Top Place in Both
Matches.

**AND CARRIED OFF THREE SILVER
CUPS—TEAM MATCH WON BY
STANLEY.**

The annual prize meeting of the York County Rifle Association was held on the range at Stanley on Friday. The number of entries was the largest for several years, no less than 36 competitors facing the butts. The weather was fine and warm, and the conditions generally were favorable for good shooting.

The feature of the meeting was the splendid work done by A. E. Massie, of this city. Prior to yesterday, Mr. Massie had not gripped the butt of a rifle for two years, but this did not hinder him from walking off with the Vanwart and Elder silver cups, and also the cup given for the best aggregate. He took the wind completely out of the sails of the Stanley marksmen, and was the hero of the hour with the dozen or so competitors from the city.
