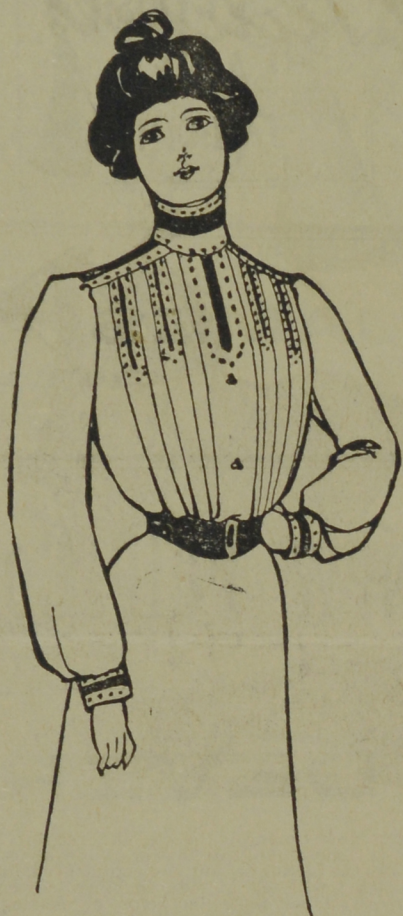

Veils and Hats For the Early Summer.

Ordinary net veils are worn either short or long and are gathered in at the top by means of a jeweled veil pin. Veils of white application are the most elegant, although for ceremonious toilet

no veil whatever is admissible. Application veils of a russet tone are new. The design is so complicated as to almost conceal the face, unless, as is sometimes the case, it is worn with the heavy border uppermost at the brim of the hat.

Speaking of hats, they are large, but flat. The decoration is massed, and there are no aligrets, high bows or sprays. Clusters of flowers, rolls of silk, gauze or lace and plumes laid horizontally are the preferred decorations.

The shirt waist illustrated is of white taffeta and is laid in box plaits in front, the back being plain. At the top of each plait is a strap of blue satin with lines of tiny gold buttons at each side of it. A strip of blue silk with lines of gold buttons passes down the shoulder seam also, and the collar is trimmed to match, as are the cuffs of the full sleeves. The blue belt is fastened by a gold buckle.
