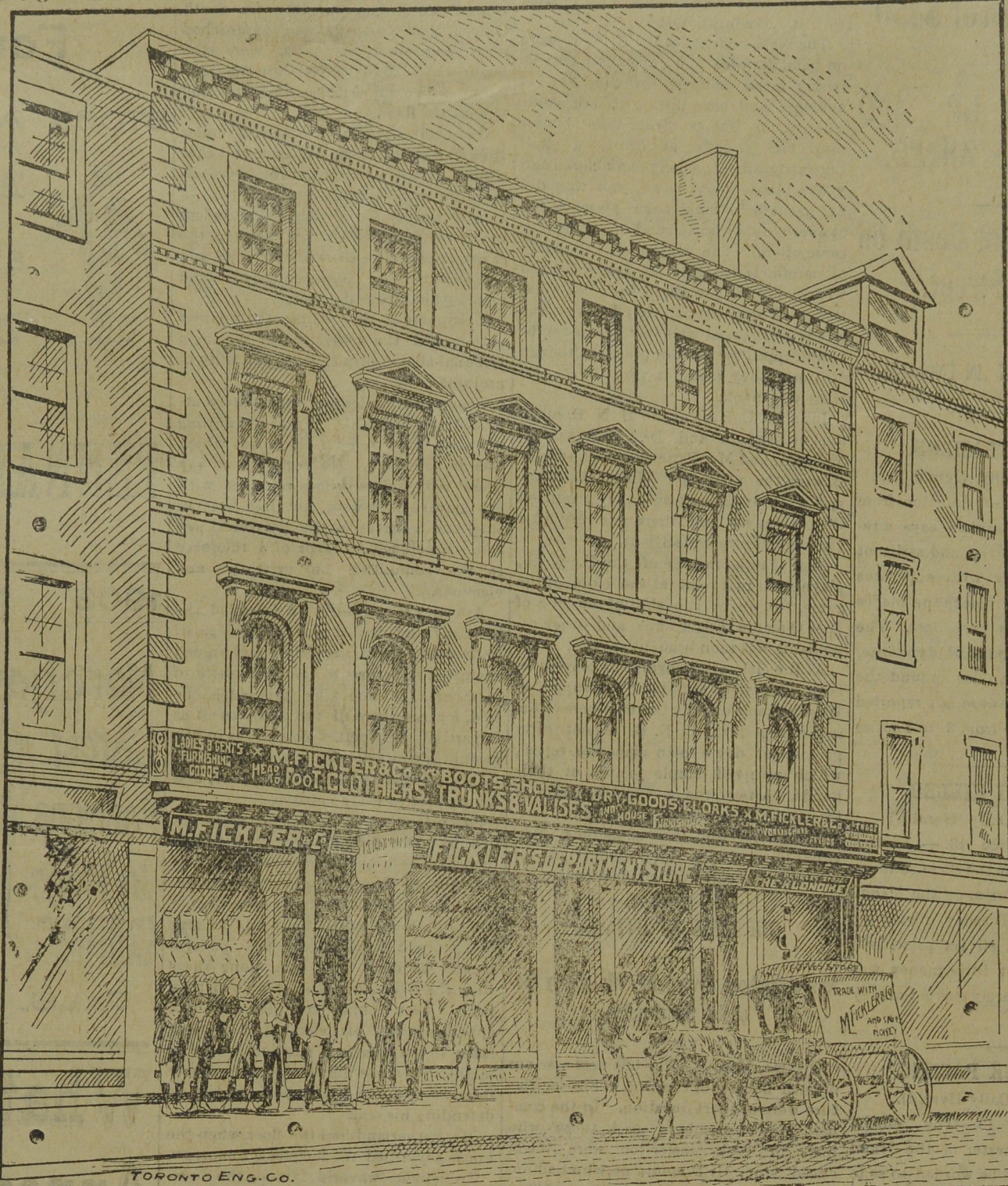

DEPUTY MINISTER OF JUSTICE.

A Nova Scotian Who is Possessed of a Calm, Judicial Temperament.

Mr. E. L. Newcombe, K. C., is possessed of a calm, judicial temperament, which is admirably suited to the office of Deputy Minister of Justice. He was born in 1850, at Cornwallis, King's County, Nova Scotia, and educated at the High School, Truro, N. S., and at Dalhousie College, receiving from the latter institution the degrees of B. A. and M. A. He is also a graduate of the University of Halifax, which conferred upon him the degree of LL. B. in 1881. In January, 1883, he

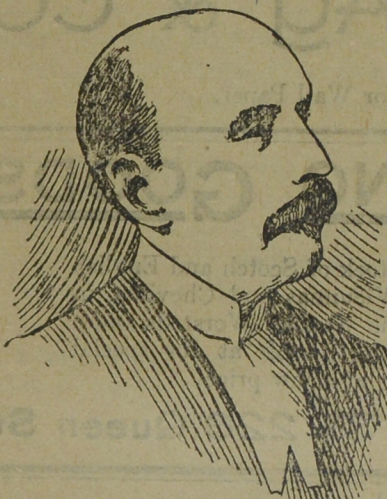
was called to the Bar, and for three years practiced law at Kentville, N. S., but subsequently carried on his profession at Halifax, until his appointment in March, 1893, to the office of Deputy Minister of Justice. In December of the same year he was called to the Bar of Ontario. Mr. Newcombe was entrusted by the Government with a mission to England on the copyright question in 1895, and has frequently argued before the Privy Council on questions of great importance. He was created a Queen's Counsel in 1893.

Will Marry M. Bois.

The engagement of Miss Emma Calve, the prima donna, to M. Bois, the well known Parisian journalist, is announced. It is understood that the marriage will take place within a few weeks. M. Bois is a recognized authority on occultism and he has contributed several books to the literature of the mystical science. Mme. Calve, it is said, is in harmony with her intended husband upon the question of occultism, and their mutual beliefs and pursuits in this field brought them together in associations which have ripened into a betrothal.

Great Britain's Secretary of War

Mr. William St. John Brodrick, British secretary of war, is the son and heir of Viscount Middleton. He is forty-four years old, for twenty-two of which he has had a seat in the House of Commons. He has been in the war office with but slight intervals since 1886.

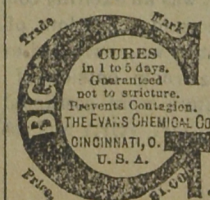
