KESTREL LAUNCHED

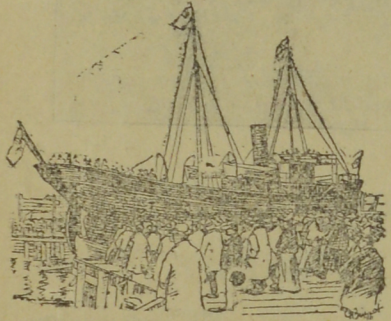
NEW DOMINION FISHERIES CRUISER
AT VANCOUVER, B.C.

A Distinctly Canadian Vessel, Manufactured With Materials Supplied by This Country—Her Measurements and Her Solid, Almost Pugnacious Bow—Appropriation of \$80,000, Made by Parliament, May Have Been Exceeded.

At the early hour of 7 on the morning of Saturday, Feb. 14, the new Dominion fisheries protection cruiser Kestrel was launched at Vancouver in the presence of a crowd of many hundred people, who had braved the chill of the morning air to watch the interesting event.

Mrs. Wallace, wife of the builder, broke the time-honored bottle of champagne and pronounced the name that will henceforth adorn the first Government vessel built on the Pacific coast. Not a hitch occurred in the proceedings, and when the attendant tugs had hauled away the timbers of the cradle the Kestrel sat firmly on the water.

The work of construction was commenced about the middle of June, 1901, the unusual length of time consumed being the bursting of her first boilers under severe tests to which they were subjected by Lloyds before they were allowed to leave England. In every particular the new cruiser is a splendid example of the thoroughly modern work now being done in Canadian shipyards, for she is magnificently finished and is as tight a craft as can be found in the Pacific waters. Moreover, the Kestrel must ever appeal to the

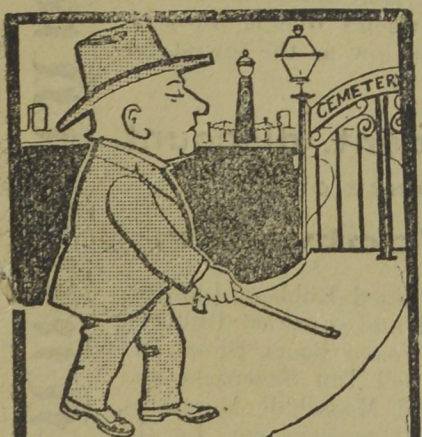


NEW DOMINION CRUISER KESTREL.

hearts of loyal Canadians on account of the fact that the materials used in her construction have been, wherever possible, obtained in this country. She is a distinctly Canadian vessel.

The cruiser's measurements are 145 feet in length over all, 24 feet beam, 13 feet load water line, 13 feet 6 inches in depth and 10 feet 3 inches draught. Strength and utility were carefully considered in her plans, hence the ram nose, the solid almost pugnacious bow, and the general bulldog appearance which is such a striking characteristic. Her whole hull is sheathed with Muntz metal, the cost of which is enormous.

The engines, which have 600 indicated horsepower and are 18x38 by 24 feet in dimension, were constructed by the Polson Iron Works of Toronto. They are fore and aft compounds, surface condensing, and are fitted with a boiler that will have a working pressure of 152 pounds of steam. All the machinery installed

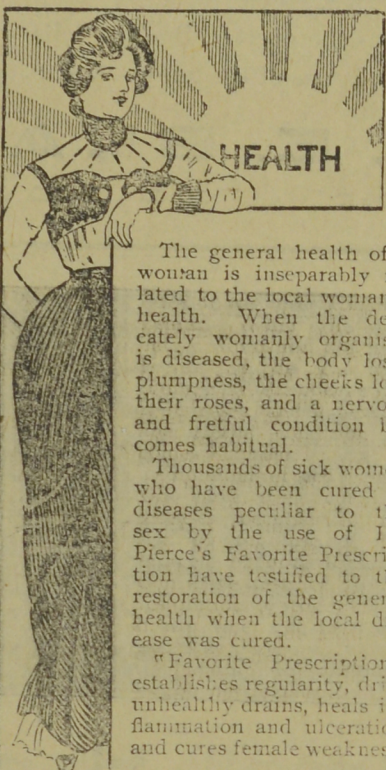

on the cruiser is of the latest and most improved pattern. Tyzack's triple grip anchors, Lord Kelvin's compass and barometers, two of Ritchies' patent compasses, Cahburns telltale self-illuminating indicators, electric lights both down below and at the masthead and a searchlight of intense powers are merely a few of the modern appliances that help to make the Kestrel a model of nautical completeness.

Twenty souls all told will man the cruiser, a crew of fifteen and five officers. The snug and comfortable quarters provided are trimmed with richly polished quartered oak, the numerous pilasters surmounted with Corinthian capitals finished in gold. Steam heated, electric lighted, carpeted with Brussels and furnished with everything that experience could suggest or ingenuity devise, the officer's quarters are calculated to satisfy even the most fastidious.

While native woods have been employed wherever possible, it was necessary to use teak in a number of cases, particularly for the heavy sliding door of the companionway leading to the after cabins. The appropriation made by the Dominion Government for the construction of the Kestrel was \$80,000, but so complete and thorough has been the work that this figure will scarcely meet the total expense.

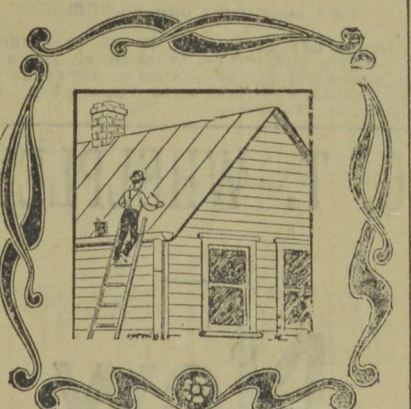
