THE LEGISLATURE.

Debate on Address Stood Over.

At the opening of the Legislature this afternoon Hon. Dr. Pugsley, who was leading the House, announced that on account of Premier Tweedie being confined to his room by a serious attack of la grippe, the debate on the address would not be resumed until Monday.

Hon. Mr. Pugsley also made announcement to the House of the recent changes in the cabinet. He explained that Hon. Mr. Hill's resignation was not due to any difference with the government on questions of policy, but was the outcome of a difficulty which arose in Charlotte county during the recent elections. The withdrawal of the hon. gentlemen was a cause for sincere regret to the Premier and his colleagues.

In announcing the appointment of Hon. Mr. McKeown to the office of solicitor general, Hon. Mr. Pugsley, paid a well deserved tribute to that gentleman. The vacancy, he said, had been filled after very careful consideration on the part of the executive, who felt that their action would have a tendency to secure a more economic administration of the criminal law.

Notices of enquiry for Tuesday next on various matters were given by Messrs. Hazen, Smith, Flemming and Glasier.

The debate on the Winding Ledge Dam resolution is now on.

Bounty for Hedgehogs.

It is not improbable that the surveyor general may be asked during the present session of the Legislature to amend the

game law, so as to provide for the payment of a bounty of fifty cents each upon hedgehogs. It is claimed that these animals are multiplying very rapidly in some sections of the province, according to those connected with the lumbering industry, and have become a nuisance. They are said to be particularly destructive to young trees, and this is the principal reason being put forward for placing a bounty upon their heads.

CABINET RESIGNED.

Sofia, Bulgaria, March 27.—The entire cabinet, has resigned owing to inability to find any one who would accept the portfolio of war unless the cabinet should agree to army appropriations. It was for this reasons that Major Gen. Paprikoff, former minister of war resigned March 8, his colleagues having rejected his demands for a credit of \$1,000,000 for the purchase of war material.

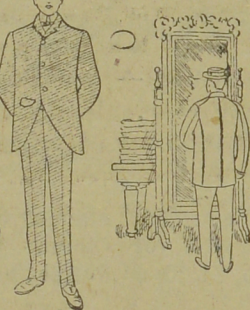

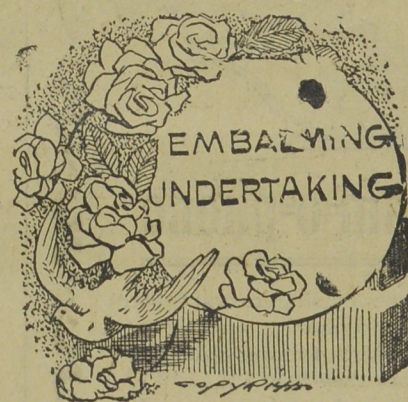
