CONSPIRATOR GAMEY.

The Gamey charges against Prov. Sec'y Stratton of Ontario were received with great acclaim by the Conservatives, and the conspirator for a time was elevated to the pedestal of a life size hero. The Rose government no doubt felt the seriousness of the situation, and well they might. They promptly provided for a full investigation, and it has been proceeding before a couple of judges, but was abruptly adjourned Tuesday until Thursday at the suggestion of Gamey's counsel, who apparently were anxious to withdraw from the enquiry.

The reason for the break is the absence of Gamey, and it is the Tories' time to feel foolish. They cannot explain Gamey's absence, but other people are suggesting reasons why he has fled to Buffalo. At Monday's session of the court, Gamey's partner gave evidence indicating that the conspirator committed forgery, and it is said that fear of prosecution for the offence is the reason for his flight. The circumstances certainly look suspicious. Gamey is a member of the legislature, and even if his presence was not necessary at the enquiry Tuesday, he was due at the sitting of the House.

In the meantime the Tory hero, if hero he is any longer considered by even his own party, is safe at Buffalo. He says he will be back in Toronto when required, but of that there is considerable doubt. The judges however have decided that the investigation shall proceed in the public interest, even with Gamey absent, and the friends of the provincial secretary and the government are not without hope that he and they will be vindicated. The force of Gamey's evidence has certainly been shattered by other testimony, notably that of his own business partner, and it may be that the whole fabric will fall before the evidence to be offered by the defence.

A Buffalo despatch says Gamey is returning to Toronto.

THE LOCAL BUDGET.

Hon. Mr. Tweedie is still suffering from the effects of his recent illness, and when half through his budget speech was forced to defer finishing it until this afternoon. The Premier, however, made a vigorous and inspiring address, presenting his views on the subject of provincial finances in language at once practical and eloquent.

He was able to point with pride and satisfaction to the splendid manner in which the government's policy for the development of New Brunswick resources had been justified by actual results.

The efforts of the administration to encourage and foster agriculture, resulting in a wonderful increase in the volume of dairy products and the exploitation of our mineral wealth seen in the extension of coal raising, and oil production, were matters for which the Premier properly claimed credit for the government, and the facts which he presented in these respects are undeniable.

The Premier found reason for congratulation in the present condition of all the great industries of the province, and his speech was buoyant and hopeful, as the conditions fully warranted.

Dealing with the public debt, Mr. Tweedie showed that our liabilities had been contracted for useful and necessary public works demanded by the people, but he strongly condemned the policy of a former government which had parted with a large portion of the crown land domain to subsidize a railway.

The House listened with great interest to the Premier's address, and at its close the members heartily congratulated him on his able presentation of the budget.

Alleged That Gamey
is Returning to
Toronto.

COUNSEL FOR DEFENCE

Says He Will Have Con-
spirator Apprehended.

CHARGED THAT LATTER IS GUILTY OF
FORGERY.

Buffalo, N. Y. April 22.—Gamey is still here, but he declares that he has not done anything wrong, and will return to Toronto. He says he is only here for a rest.

Toronto, April 22.—E. F. B. Johnston, counsel for the defence, says that if Gamey returns to Toronto he will certainly be placed under arrest.

The astute lawyer declares that he has got Gamey just where he wants him.

Toronto, April 22.—The mystery of Gamey's whereabouts has for the present been solved, by the discovery of the fact that he registered at the Mansion House, Buffalo, Sunday, and was still there late yesterday afternoon. He was called up on long distance telephone when, after a few preliminary questions, the following conversation ensued: "Are you coming back to Toronto?" Gamey was asked.

"I'll be back whenever they want me," was the answer.

"And you're not gone for good?" was the next question.

"What, leave the country?" repeated Gamey. "How could I leave the country? No, I haven't left the country, and why should I leave it?"

"They're talking about this \$900 deposit," was the answer. They say the teller's initials were forged to the deposit slip, and that you are away on that account."

"I have done nothing in regard to the deposit slip or anything else," was Gamey's answer. "I am not here to keep out of the way on account of anything I've done, and I'm not keeping out of the way at all.

"And you intend to come back?"

"Of course I intend to come back," "My friends need not worry on my account. My absence will be explained all in good time, and I will be on hand when I'm wanted. There need be no mistake about that."

Counsel for the defence in the Gamey-Stratton case intend to lay the facts of Gamey's recent proceedings before the crown attorney, and claims the evidence shows the member for Manitoba guilty of mutilation and destruction of evidence, larceny of bank deposit slip, and two charges of forgery in connection with the withdrawal of slip from bank.

It is claimed that when Gamey got the original deposit slip from the teller of the Ontario bank Saturday last he made two other slips, and returned them to the teller, the first one being refused, Gamey having retained the original and signed the teller's initials.

It is even hinted there is a warrant out for Gamey's arrest on charge of forging the teller's initials to a substituted deposit slip.

Mr. Blake, counsel for Gamey at the enquiry, referred to the unaccountable absence of Gamey, and said he and his colleagues were inclined, subject to the wishes of the commissioners, to withdraw from the case.

Chancellor Boyd urged Mr. Blake to continue the case, as the public interest demanded an efficient enquiry. The court then adjourned by consent until 10 o'clock Thursday when Frank Sullivan and his father-in-law, Geo. Mason, will be called and their evidence will conclude the prosecution's case.

Gamey's counsel have heard nothing more of his whereabouts.

Buffalo, April 22.—Gamey left for Toronto at one o'clock.
