False Teeth From Stomach.

Niagara Falls, N. Y., Nov. 30.—Dr. Roswell Park, of Buffalo, who attended President McKinley on his death bed, has successfully performed an operation on Frederick C. Smith of this city, for the removal of two false teeth from his stomach. The first operation was unsuccessful. The second operation was performed just as soon as the patient had rallied sufficiently from the shock of the first operation to stand it.

Smith is young and vigorous. He is a yardmaster of the Lehigh Valley Railroad in this city. On Friday night during a fit of coughing he swallowed a plate containing two false teeth. The teeth first lodged in the oesophagus and did not cause much distress. Mr. Smith felt his predicament so keenly that he would not tell his co-laborers what his trouble was, but he soon left work and consulted Dr. O. E. McCarty, of this city. That physician advised him to go to Buffalo for an operation.

Dr. Park made an examination, and advised an operation at once. It was performed at the Buffalo General Hospital but it was not successful, and it was found that the teeth had passed down into the stomach. Dr. Park advised the patient of the seriousness of an operation to remove the teeth, and Smith at once consented to take the chances, as there seemed no other way of obtaining relief.

Mr. Smith was made as comfortable as possible in the hospital, and a second operation was performed today. The X ray was used to locate the teeth. The stomach was then cut open and the foreign matter removed. Mr. Smith is doing well.
