The picture shows a smart costume which can be made up in any shade of cloth. The hat is especially good and the plaited skirt worthy of notice.

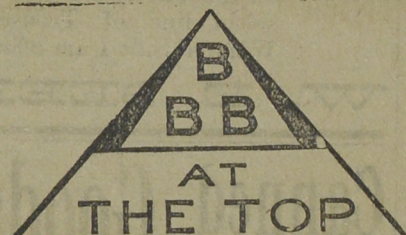
