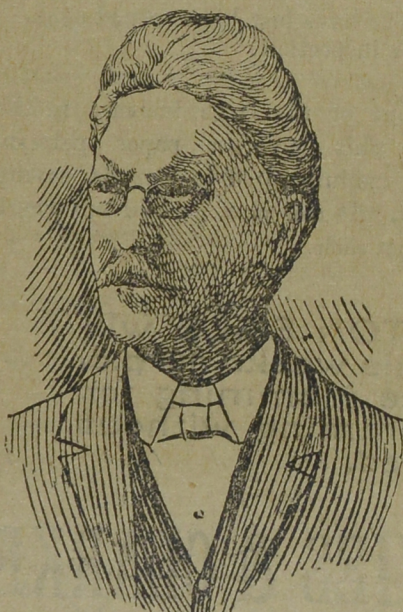
OUR MINING EXPERT.

Canada's Superintendent of Mines Is a Native of Silesia—His Quick Work in Establishing Assay Office.

Dr. Haanel, Canadian Superintendent of Mines, was born in the City of Breslau, Silesia, on May 24, 1841. He was educated in the Gymnasium in that city, and received the degree of A.M. from Ohio University in 1868, and that of Ph.D. from Breslau University in 1873. From 1866 to 1867 Dr. Haanel was professor of

science at Adrian College, Michigan, and from 1868 to 1872 professor of natural science at Albion College, in the same State. In 1875 he was appointed professor of natural science at Victoria University, a position which he retained until 1889. His stay at Victoria was advantageous both to the students and to the institution itself. It is worthy of note Faraday Hall, the first science hall that he established during this time founded in Canada. While at Victoria he was Dean of the Faculty of Science. In 1889 Dr. Haanel went to Syracuse University, and the erection of a hall of physics there was largely due to his efforts. In June, 1901, Dr. Haanel was appointed Superintendent of Mines for Canada. One of his first duties was the establishment and equipment of an assay office at Vancouver, which was accomplished by him in the phenomenal space of 3½ weeks. The assay office is perhaps one of the best equipped places of the kind on the American continent. Few persons, however, know the efforts that were required to obtain the appliances in the United States within the limited time allowed. Dr. Haanel is a man of fine intellect and genial manners. He is thoroughly conversant with the latest developments and discoveries in modern science.

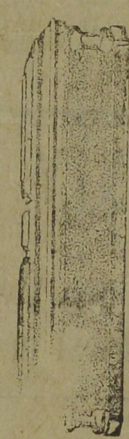
