Ingrowing Toe Nails.

To relieve ingrowing toe nails cut a V shaped piece out of the center of the nail, as deep down to the quick as possible, and press in all around the toe and as much as possible under the ingrowing part some good yellow soap. In the course of a few days or so take the pointed end of a small penknife blade and scrape out all the soap and if possible insert the blade under the ingrowing part and with a dexterous twist turn the edge of the blade upward and pare off as much of the ingrowing part as possible. Then press in some more soap and a small piece of absorbent cotton between the nail and the overlapping flesh to keep the nail from pressing on the same. In the course of a few weeks the flesh under the ingrowing part will become so callous that no pain will be felt, and the nail can be trimmed regularly once a week.

One of the "Nine Martyrs."

The late Mr. Justice Lount, it is recalled, was one of the "nine martyrs," a political phrase dating back to 1867, and now almost forgotten. When Lord Monck (acting, of course, on the suggestion of his Prime Minister, Sir John Macdonald), selected a leading Liberal statesman, Hon. John Sandfield Macdonald, to form a Ministry for Ontario, the latter formed it on a coalition basis, half Liberal and half Conservative. By so doing he secured the support of the Conservative members in the Legislature and nine Liberal members. The latter were hotly denounced by The Globe and the official Liberal party as recreants, threatened with defeat at the next general election, and so sternly assailed for supporting Sandfield Macdonald that they were dubbed the "nine martyrs." Mr. Lount had been elected for North Simcoe in 1867 as a Liberal. When the elections of 1871 came round neither party would adopt him. The Conservatives ran W. D. Ardagh, who was elected, and the Liberals, H. H. Cook, and Lount came in at the end of the poll.

Lord Derby's Home.

Knowsley, which the King was lately visiting, has welcomed many of the English Sovereigns, and the house retains some interesting proofs of Royal gratitude; but there is also a striking commemoration of a King's ingratitude. It is carved on the colonnade end of the house, and the inscription runs: "James, Earl of Derby, Lord of Man and the Isles, grandson of James, Earl of Derby, and of Charlotte, daughter of Claude, Duke de la Tremouille, whose husband, James, was beheaded at Bolton, xv. Oct. mdciii., for strenuously adhering to Charles the II., who refused a bill passed unanimously by both Houses of Parliament for restoring to the family the estate lost by his loyalty to him." Coats of paint have failed to obliterate the record on the stone, though time has effaced Charles II's ingratitude from the memory of the family.

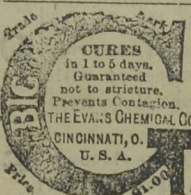
