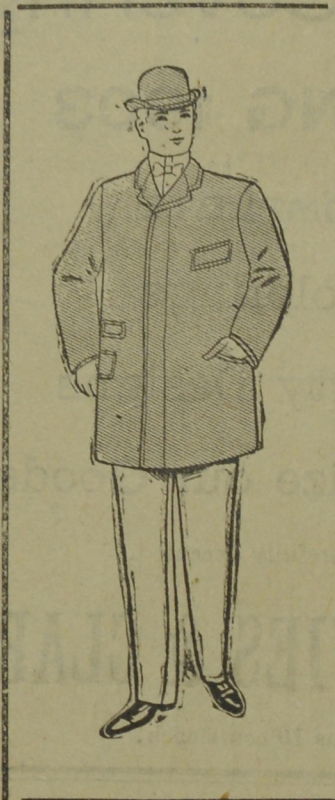

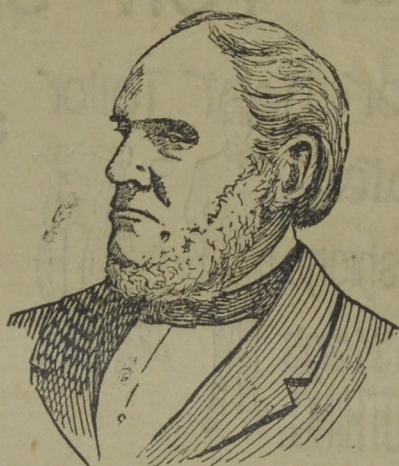
SENATOR WARK.

Canadian Who Is Probably the Oldest Legislator in Active Parliamentary Service in the World.

Hon. David Wark, member of the Senate of Canada, on Feb. 19, 1903, entered upon his hundredth year, and is probably the oldest active legislator in the world. Senator Wark, who is of Scotch descent, was born near Londonderry, Ireland, February 19, 1804, emigrated to New Brunswick in 1825, engaged in mercantile life, and in 1843 entered the New Brunswick Legislature. In 1851 he was appointed to the Legislative Council, and from 1858 to 1862 was

a member of the New Brunswick Government. At Confederation, in 1867, he was called to the Senate of Canada by royal proclamation, and thus he has occupied a place in the upper Chamber during Canada's entire existence as a nation. During all these years he has actively promoted the closer union of the various Provinces of the Dominion, and of Canada to the motherland. Not alone as a legislator has the aged Senator promoted these principles, he has ably supported them with his pen, his latest publication being "The Future of Canada and its Relation to the British Empire" (1894). He has also written on reciprocity with the United States. In 1897 he moved a resolution in the Senate favoring the closer union of the colonies and the mother country.

Mr. Wark is still a man of keen intellect and sound judgment. He takes the greatest interest in the business of the Senate, and a couple of years ago delivered an address of

some length, suggesting a better division of work between the Senate and the Commons, so that the Senators might have work enough to keep them busy through the entire session. The year before last he was a few weeks late in his arrival at Ottawa, and explained in the most matter of fact way that he was building a new house, and that it was not completed when the session opened. Everyone connected with the Canadian Parliament is proud of Senator Wark, and his birthday is a day of rejoicing in Ottawa. The Senator is a Liberal.

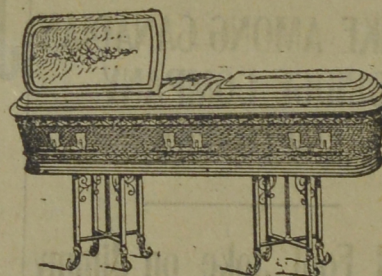

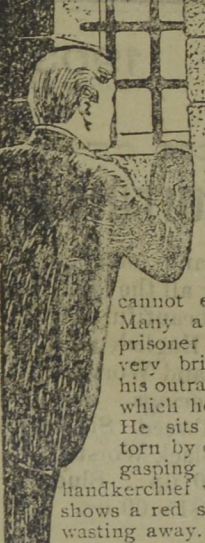
