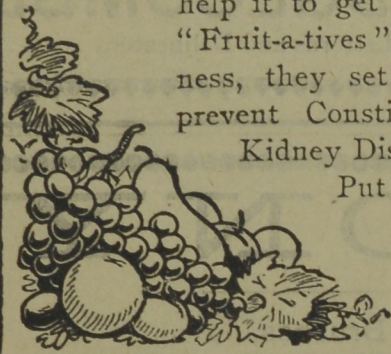

ETON'S HEADMASTER RESIGNS.

Dr. Warre Has Held the Position for Twenty Years.

Dr. Edmond Warre, Eton's famous headmaster, has announced his intention of retiring at midsummer next.

Dr. Warre's connection with the college extends over a period of forty-four years, for the last twenty of which he has been headmaster.

Born in London in 1837, he was himself an Eton boy of some note, and Newcastle scholar. From Eton he went to Oxford becoming scholar of Balliol in 1855 and winning many distinctions. In 1860 he became assistant master at Eton.

He rowed in the Oxford boat in three successive years—1857, 1858 and 1859—and the latter year was made president of the O.U.B.C. It was he, too, who designed the Brocas boat, in which Oxford won the classic race three years ago.

Dr. Warre smiled a little sadly over the general notion as to his never-failing strength.

"Really," he said, "I have been ill, and I am an old man, and I've had forty-five years of work and strain. It has been a huge responsibility. I think," he added with a little laugh, "that I have earned a rest. I want to retire before I wear out or break down."

"Of course," he continued, "it will be a great wrench indeed. I never have a moment during the day, and then there are piles of letters to be answered. But after all—His eyes glistened. To be headmaster of Eton for a generation is to be part of history.

Then Dr. Warre smiled brightly, and said he hoped to get a great deal of peace and quiet out of life.

"There are so many ways in which

old age can be useful and dignified," he said. "Now, there is gardening, and there are many literary schemes to which my mind turns. For instance, I am keenly interested in the matter of ancient naval tactics."

Madness in Armies.

The hardships and bad food as well as the nervous tension caused by the ever present danger all predispose the soldier in the field to nervous derangements and insanity. Russian physicians report that in the wars with both Turkey and China a large number of acute psychoses were met with, and many men who had gone mad were shot that they might not fall into the hands of Chinese torturers. 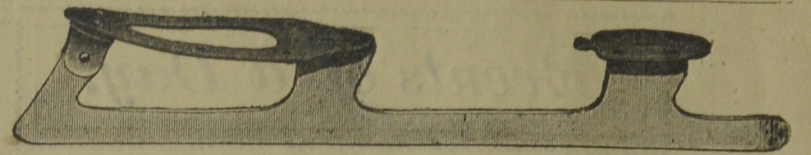

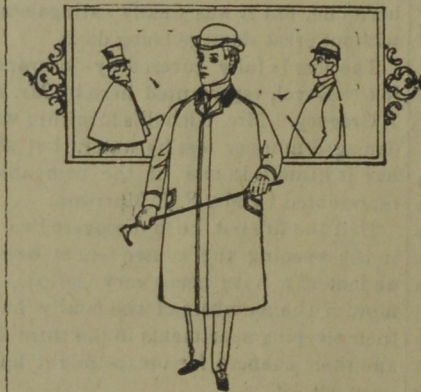

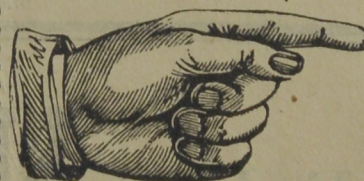
