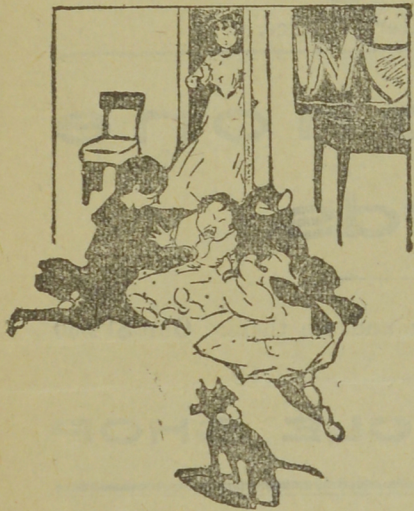
### Condensed Sentiment.

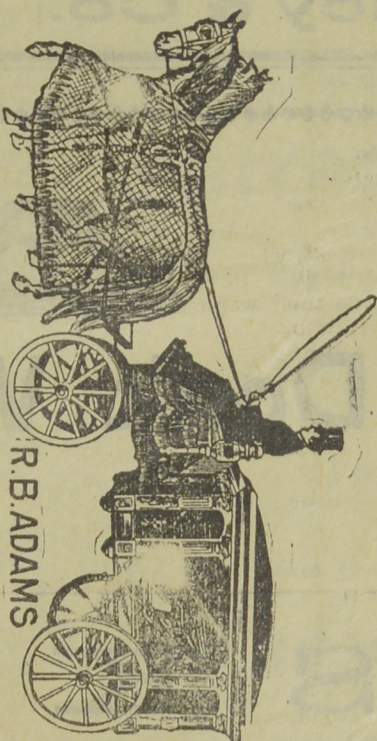
