It is believed that 646 persons were lost in the wreck of the steamship Norge off the coast of Scotland. The number of saved reaches 128.

The new gymnasium for the University will soon be a matter of reality. The plans are ready and tenders are being asked for the construction of the work.

From Sir Frederick Borden's answer in parliament it is learned that Col. White, D. O. C., recommended both Col. Jones, his son-in-law, and Col. McLean, for the position of Brigadier of the Sussex camp.

It is said that Hon. A. R. McClellan, ex-governor of this province, has been offered the chairmanship of the government commission for the construction of the eastern section of Grand Trunk Pacific railway.

In the House of Commons yesterday Hon. Mr. Emmerson introduced the railway estimates, and spoke at length of I. C. R. affairs. The deficit, he explained, is due to the greatly increased cost of fuel and the increase of employees' wages.

The strike situation at Sydney, N. S., is assuming serious conditions. The steel company are endeavoring to start up their works, but the strikers are attempting to prevent non-union men entering the works, and it has been found necessary to call out the militia to aid the civil authorities in preserving order and to protect the company's property. It is hoped that there will be no bloodshed, but the seriousness of the situation gives cause for grave apprehension in that respect.

The Democratic National Convention for the nomination of candidates for the presidency and vice presidency of the United States, which opened at St. Louis today, promises to be a hot gathering. The names of Judge Parker and W. R. Hearst will be put forward for the first place on the ticket, and it is altogether likely that the former will secure the plum, although it is possible a dark horse, possibly Cleveland, if he will accept, may stampede the gathering.

STORMED THE BARRICADE.

British Sailors Bound to Return to Their Ship.

The London Daily Mail of June 18th has the following: There was an exciting incident yesterday afternoon at a railway station in Rome in connection with a visit of sixty odd Catholic bluejackets and marines from H. M. S. Implacable and Pandora to Rome, to be received by the Pope. Having heard that the two vessels had received orders to leave Italy suddenly for Malta, his Holiness at once interrupted a private audience and gave a short address to the men, which contained the striking sentence, "Be Christian men, and be loyal to that banner which allows you the privilege of coming to receive the blessing of the head of your faith."

At 2 o'clock the men returned to the station for their journey to Civita Vecchia but were refused admission, as they only had third-class tickets, and the express was made up of first and second. Half an hour later their officers arrived and placing themselves at the head of their men ordered them to storm the barricades and occupy the train, which was done. As it would have taken a regiment to remove them, the authorities allowed the

train to depart, only a few minutes late, with Jack Tare grinning all along the windows.

Southam (Grimsbury), one house; population, 1 (an old man).

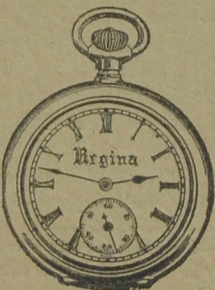
FROG BOAT CALM.
