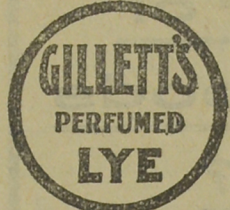

REMARKABLE OPERATION.

Criminal Instincts in a Boy
Are Corrected.SURGICAL OPERATION RESULTS IN
COMPLETE CHANGE OF MIND

In a Formerly Incurable Boy.

Indianapolis, Ind., Sept. 16.—The correction of criminal instincts by a surgical operation is the latest feat of the Juvenile Court.

Jesse Beard, fifteen years old, was brought into the Juvenile court in March by his mother, Mrs. Matilda Beard of No. 652 Arch Street, and was charged with being incorrigible. He had been away from home five days, and the mother and sister of the boy thought that he should be put in some institution where he could be managed. Pending an investigation of the case, Mrs. Helen W. Rogers, chief probation officer, and others of the court, conceived the idea that a physical defect was responsible for the lad's mental attitude. The mother and sister then remembered a fall received by the boy when three years old. He had struck his head on a rock in a stream where he was swimming. Dr. Kohlmer's examination showed a concave formation of the skull where it should have been convex. Arrangements for an operation were made, but they were not carried out until July 5th, as the boy had run away in the meantime.

The operation by Dr. Kohlmer involved the removal of three pieces of the skull on the under side of which he found three growths pressing against the head. The boy was allowed to leave the hospital fourteen days later, well and strong as ever, but showing a remarkable difference in his manner. The old enclines and ungovernable temper was gone, and he was perfectly amenable to the wishes of his mother.

The mind of the boy was cleared and he seemed extremely bright. It is believed that he will learn rapidly in school and make up for the worthless years. He understands what has happened to him, and says he is very thankful to the court and to the doctor.

He will enter a special school in connection with Shortridge High School, maintained for truants and backward students, this week. The boy has not been in school for three years because of his incorrigibility, and at the time he was taken out of school he had reached only the second grade—the class of boys eight years old.

FREE BAPTISTS

Approve of the Amended Basis of Union.

Tracey, Sept. 16.—The ministerial session of the Free Baptist conference opened this morning at nine o'clock with a full attendance. After preliminaries, Rev. David Long of St. John was elected moderator of the conference, with Rev. B. N. Nobles of Sussex, assistant moderator. Rev. F. C. Hartley, secretary, having resigned on account of leaving the province. Rev. A. C. Prosser, the new pastor of Waterloo street church, was elected secretary.

A resolution was submitted to the effect that the amended basis of Baptist union is acceptable. This drew forth a lengthy discussion. During the earlier part of the day it seemed as though the union movement would be defeated, as many of the older men were opposed to it. But after the matter had been most cleverly explained some of these overcame their objections and on the vote being taken the motion was carried, 29 to 7.

Rev. J. C. Wilson, of Gibson, preached this evening at 7 o'clock.

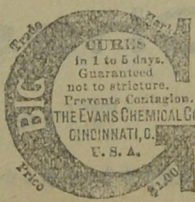
