THE THIBETANS.

Making it Unpleasant for British Force Practically Besieged.

Silma, British India, May 13.—Half a battalion of Fusiliers and half a battalion of naval infantry with four 10-pounder guns have been warned to prepare for service in Thibet.

The Thibetans have taken the offensive against the British Mission camp here. From a fort about six furlongs away they are steadily bombarding the camp with half dozen guns carrying cannon balls of a pound weight. Another large gathering of Thibetans is reported from the Rong Valley and although the British communications in the rear are still open, the mission is practically besieged.

Gyangtse, Thibet, May 12.—The British troops made a reconnaissance in force yesterday, Col. Brander taking the larger part of the garrison to flank the hills behind the east of Jong. The monastery on the mountain side was visited because it had harbored the enemy's horsemen two days ago, but it was found inhabited merely by aged monks from Gompa and therefore was left unharmed. No opposition was offered by the Thibetans until the column had nearly returned, when a hot fire was opened from Jong, where the jinglas apparently had been considered re-enforced. The firing continued for nearly an hour after the safe return of the troops, and excellent practice was made.

I regret to announce that confirmation has been received of the report that Capt. Parr's servants were put to death with barbarity, being slowly cut to pieces. Sung, the Chinaman who was taken yesterday and released today admitted that the Chinese general Paru was responsible for this outrage by deliberate inaction.

The bombardment was renewed at 5 o'clock this afternoon and kept up till dark. This morning a village about 1,500 yards east from which our chief defences could be enfiladed, was occupied and partially destroyed by the 32nd Pioneers, but our force was insufficient for both places.

The Thibetans are reported advancing lines of sangars on the plain under the protection of fogs.

WIFE AND WIDOW.

Toronto Romance of Four Years' Duration Ends in a Death Bed.

Bride, wife and widow within one short hour is the sad fate of Mrs. Godfrey S. Morgan, of Toronto who was Miss Frances M. Hitchens, of Rome Place 274 Dovercourt road.

It is seldom that the hand of death follows so swiftly after that of the clergyman, but in this case the wedding ceremony took place while the bridegroom lay on his deathbed, and all present had a full knowledge that the hand of fate was about to make a second change in the estate of the bride.

Mrs. Morgan is the daughter of Major Hitchens, and some four or five years ago paid a visit from her home in the south of England to her aunt, Mrs. Harrison, of 269 Dovercourt road, Toronto, and while here for the first time met her future husband. She has revisited Canada several times since then, and it has been known for the past two or three years that Mr. Morgan and Miss Hitchens were engaged. She came to Canada about a year ago, with the intention of remaining permanently, and would have been married last June, but the wedding was postponed by the illness of Mr.

Morgan. He suffered from a tubercular trouble. Since coming to Canada Miss Hitchens has been living with Mrs. Morgan, the mother of the deceased, and his two sisters, Misses Frida and Lena.

It became evident on Thursday evening that Mr. Morgan was sinking rapidly, and a messenger was despatched with all speed for a license and the clergyman. During the ceremony which followed the dying man was so weak he could scarcely nod his head in giving his assent. At about 11.30 death took place. In his early days the late Mr. Morgan was an athlete of considerable ability. He was a bar-ister, and was well known in the neighborhood in which he had resided for years. He attended St. Anne's Church, and was a member of St. Andrew's Brotherhood.

Godfrey Morgan was a son of Thos. Kearton Morgan, a well-known Toronto barrister, who met his death by drowning some twenty years ago, grandson of the late Judge Harrison, and nephew of Judge Morgan and Judge Boys, of Barrie.

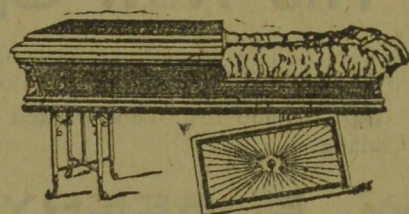

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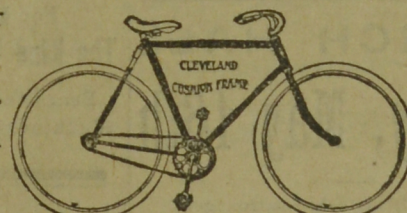

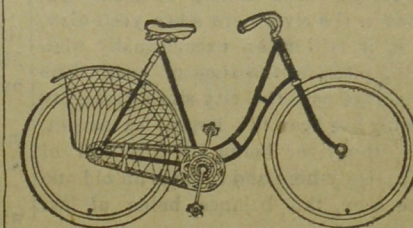
