### Bank Robber Shot Cashier.

Platte Center, Neb., Nov. 25.—William Holden, a farmhand, during the noon hour today entered the Platte Valley Bank, demanded the bank's cash, and on the refusal of Cashier Barney Schroeder to surrender it, shot the latter in the breast, inflicting a serious but not fatal wound. He made his escape in a buggy without securing any money.

Sheriff Carrig took up the pursuit in an automobile, a posse accompanying him on horseback. Holden was pressed hard about nine miles west of this city, and finally overhauled by Carrig. As the horsemen dashed up the robber took a close range shot at Charles C. Englehorn, whose horse shied and threw Englehorn into a barbed wire fence, where he received severe injuries.

The prisoner was taken back to Platte Centre, and Sheriff Carrig had hard work to save him from mob violence. He was positively identified by Schroeder, even though he had changed his clothing and removed a glass eye that he was wearing when he did the shooting.

Holden says his home is in Michigan. He is about thirty-five years old.

### GIRL MISSING FROM STEAMER.

Locked Stateroom on Old Dominion Liner Found Empty.

Norfolk, Va. Nov. 25.—Miss Elizabeth Hankel of 43 Crescent street, Wakefield Mass., is believed to have committed suicide at sea last night. She was supposed to be a passenger on the steamer Princess Anne of the Old Dominion Line, which arrived from New York this morning; but when the steamer reached here it was found that Miss Hankel was missing.

The young woman bought her ticket and boarded the steamer at New York.

She was not seen after she entered her stateroom. The room was found locked this morning, and when an entrance was effected a note was found lying in a berth on which was written: "Good-bye, God will take care of me." On the paper was requested that her father, F. J. Hankel, be notified.

The presumption is that when the vessel was well out at sea, the young woman climbed to the small port in her room, forced herself through, and leaped into the sea.

### Shot Down Near School.

Mount Vernon, Nov. 25.—Enraged over her refusal to marry him, Francesco Valorazzo, an Italian artist of 220 South Seventh Avenue, shot and fatally wounded Angelina Frezza of 146 South Seventh Avenue, shortly before 1 o'clock today in front of School No. 1, at South Fifth Avenue and Second Street.

The shooting was witnessed by hundreds of children returning from their luncheon. After firing three shots into the girl's body and supposing her to be dead, he left her and started to run. He was followed by five hundred children, who prevented his escape by gathering around him. While he was trying to brush the children aside and was still holding the revolver in his hands, Superintendent Murphy of the Union Railway Company caught hold of the fugitive. Valorazzo showed fight, but was quickly subdued and arrested by Policeman Marz. The wounded girl is in the Mount Vernon Hospital, where the attending physicians say she cannot recover. Valorazzo is twenty-five years old and the girl eighteen years old.

### By Way of Behring Straits.

Seattle, Wash., Nov. 25.—Cable and telegraphic communication with Siberia, the Orient, and the old world countries by way of Behring Straits is proposed by John Rosene, managing director of the Northeastern Siberian Company. He intimates that if the United States government will extend its Nome telegraph line from Nome to Cape Prince of Wales, and thence establish the wireless system across Behring Strait between Cape Prince of Wales and East Cape, the nearest point of the Siberian side, the intervening distance being only from 28 to 35 miles, that the Northeastern Siberian Company will build an overland telegraph line across northeastern Siberia, for the whole of which it holds a concession from the Russian Imperial government, to a connection with the telegraph line extending the full length of the Trans-Siberian Railway from Vladivostok to St. Petersburg. This would place, by means of existing cable connection, Japan, China, the Philippines, Korea, Manchuria, and other far east countries, as well as all of those of the continent of Europe, in cable and telegraphic communication with all points on the North and South American continents. It could be done, Mr. Rosene points out at a much more reasonable telegraph and cable tariff than now obtains.

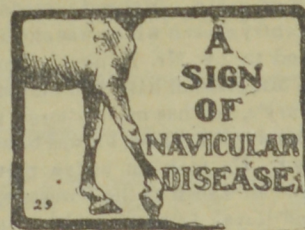

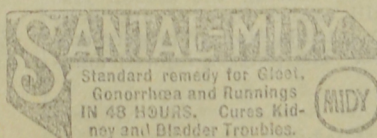
